Washington, May 11.—The international commercial question, involving the right of entry of wood pulp and paper into the United States from all countries with which America is connected by treaties of commerce, was appealed to the United States Court of Customs Appeal today. The privilege is claimed under the "favored nation" clause of the convention, because free wood pulp and paper is granted to Cacada by the only operative section of the Canadian reciprocity agreement.

The appeal was from a decision by the Board of General Appraisers at New York which held that the "favored nations" clause could be invoked as Canada was a colony and not a "nation, state or country." within the meaning of the treaties.
