## BANGOR WINS AGAIN; GREEKS LEAD THE LEAGUE

Bangor, July 29.—Bangor took the second game from Fredericton today in a closely played match by a score of 12 to 10. The game was full of misplays by both sides, making six boots apiece.

The visitors put two across in the first on a single and a base on balls coupled with two errors and Keaney being hit.

Bangor got to "Lefty" Ahearn in the first for two singles and a home run by Matthews sending in three runs. Both sides made one in the second.

It was one, two, three, in the third. The home team got to Ahearn in the fourth. Brooks singled and went to second when Ahearn fell down on a sacrifice by Carney. Reed was safe on another error. A single by Connaughton sent Brooks home. Boardman laid a pretty sacrifice and three men moved up. Then came Matthews. With two strikes on him he hit his second home run, clearing the bases.

Fredericton could do nothing with Carney until the sixth. Four singles, coupled with two boots sent in four runs. Bangor came across in their half of the sixth with three more. After Reed fielded out, Connaughton led a bevy down the third base line, and came home when Boardman hit for three bases. Matthews singled, scoring Boardman but was out at third. Dutton singled and scored on a hit by Dolan.

Fredericton came near tying it up in the eighth. A base on balls and a two base hit by Condon and an error by Boardman hit in two runs.

In the ninth after Wildes had an error, and Mores got a life on an error, but was out trying to steal. Ahearn singled and White ended the game by flying out to Reed.

In the third inning Condon replaced Keaney who hurt his ankle. It is likely that the injury will keep him out of the game the rest of the season.

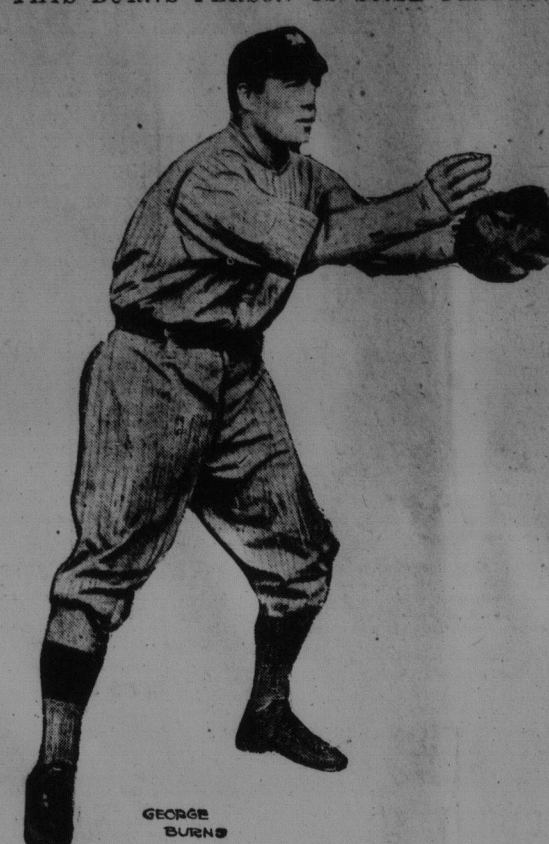

Ottawa, July 29.—For the purpose of consulting with the British Columbia government with regard to water powers in the railway belt, J. B. Chalmers, superintendent of the Dominion water powers branch and S. J. Robinson, assistant private secretary to the Minister of the Interior, leave the capital tomorrow night for the coast.

It has not yet been clearly defined as to the ownership of certain water powers there. Both the federal and the provincial governments claim ownership, and a discussion has been going on for some time, more particularly as to whether the Dominion or the provincial governments have jurisdiction over the Hudson Hope Power Company. A report will be submitted to the Minister of the Interior on the return of his officials.
