

DROP IN WATER LEVEL OF THE ST. LAWRENCE

Has Gone Down Eighteen Inches Since Saturday.

Montreal, April 12.—The water in the river here and at Sorel has gone down nearly 18 inches today as compared with Saturday. The Canadian Government steamer Lady Grey reached the De Grace about five miles below Sorel this afternoon and expects to reach Sorel tomorrow night or Wednesday morning.

Colonel Dubuc, supervising engineer of canals for the government, said today that in the absence of bad luck the Lachine Canal should be open for navigation by May first.

TRADING REPORT MONTREAL MARKET

Weakness Shown in Regard to Many Stocks.

Montreal, April 12.—The extreme weakness of the Spanish River preferred issue was the feature of today's local stock market. The stock fell 1 1/4 points in closing, sale of 139 3/4 while the common held at 96 in final sale after selling 3 1/2 points up. Sugar and Brompton were both strong, the former rising 1 1/2 points to 89 1/4 and retaining 11 1/2 points at the close and the latter rising a point to 91 3/4 and holding the gain. Brazilians added a fraction at 46 1/4 and Breweries and Steel of Canada each fell 1 1/4 points.

Strong but not active stocks were Canadian Outpost up a full point, 89; McDonald, which gained a large fraction at 32 3/4, and Merchants Bank

RAILROAD STRIKE UPSETS N. Y. STOCKS

Foreign Exchange Was Another Disquieting Influence.

New York, April 12.—The railroad strike and another flurry in money markets today against the conservative side of today's stock market, although it did not entirely restrain pools from extending their bullish commitments in certain speculative issues.

Foreign exchange was another disquieting influence, further acute depression in French, Italian and Belgian remittances forcing on those countries to new levels of discount, while the British rate also reacted.

Call loans opened at six per cent as compared with last week's final quotation of 10, but soon rose to eight and repeated the recent maximum before the close of the session.

Offerings of time money were at most negligible, except for moderate renewals.

Stocks were lower at the outset, rallied indifferently at midday, but lost ground again very generally as the broader selling which accompanied the tightening of credits at the end. Sales amounted to 1,175,000 shares.

A few issues notably food stocks, as represented by sugars and corn products and several of the less conspicuous steel and equipment retained part of their rise but otherwise the reaction carried many shares under last week's final prices.

There was much unsettlement in the bond market, resulting mainly from heavy selling of Liberty issues. Of this group the second 4's and the second, third and four 4 1/2's established lowest quotations yet recorded. Investment railroad and industrial bonds also reacted sharply.

Total sales (per value) aggregated \$13,765,000.

Old U. S. Bonds unchanged on call, which added a point at 100.

Weak issues were Dominion Textile which sold down three points at 132; Asbestos preferred, which lost 1 1/2 points at 88 1/2 and Bank of Montreal down two points at 210.

Total trading unlisted 1700; bonds \$34,400.

Income Tax Return on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

Dominion of Canada ALL persons residing in Canada, employed in Canada, or carrying on business in Canada, are liable to a tax on income, as follows:—

1. Every unmarried person, or widow, or widower, without dependants as defined by the Act, who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$1,000 or more.

2. All other individuals who during the calendar year 1919 received or earned \$2,000 or more.

3. Every corporation and joint stock company whose profits exceeded \$2,000 during the fiscal year ended in 1919.

Forms to be used in filing returns on or before the 30th of April, 1920.

ALL INDIVIDUALS other than farmers and ranchers must use Form T 1.

FARMERS AND RANCHERS must use Form T 1A.

CORPORATIONS and joint stock companies must use Form T 2.

Penalty Every person required to make a return, who fails to do so within the time limit, shall be subject to a penalty of Twenty-five per centum of the amount of the tax payable.

Any person, whether taxable, or otherwise, who fails to make a return or provide information duly required according to the provisions of the Act, shall be liable on summary conviction to a penalty of \$100 for each day during which the default continues. Also any person making a false statement in any return or in any information required by the Minister, shall be liable, on summary conviction, to a penalty not exceeding \$10,000, or to six months' imprisonment or to both fine and imprisonment.

General Instructions. Obtain Forms from the Inspectors or Assistant Inspectors of Taxation or from Postmasters.

Read carefully all instructions on Form before filling it in.

Prepay postage on letters and documents forwarded by mail to Inspectors of Taxation.

Make your returns promptly and avoid penalties.
