Colored Members Seek an Account ing of Proceeds in Writ.

The moving of the Grant African Methodist Episcopal Church from the University Ave. site to a more modest location on Soho St. has been followed by an action brought by certain members of the congregation against the pastor and two others for an accounting of the balance of \$25,600 between the two sale prices.

A writ was filed late to-day at Osgoode Hall by B. J. Spencer Pitt on behalf of James M. Jackson, S. S. Scott, W. Waldron and Lawrence Best, claiming to represent the other members against Rev. T. H. Henderson, Naomi Pasco and Edith Johnson.

The writ asks for the return of all moneys "unlawfully received by the Rev. Henderson from the proceeds and all moneys appropriated from the said amount or ob tained unlawfully or by misrepresentation or fraud from this fund."

An injunction is asked to restrain the defendants from issuing cheques on the special funds from the sale of the University Ave. property now said to be on deposit in the Dominion Bank, College and Spadina Branch.
