Colored Members Seek an Account
ing of Proceeds in Writ.

The moving of the Grant Afri-
can Methodist Episcopal Church
from the University Ave. site to a
more modest location on Soho St.
has been followed by an action
brought by certain members of
the congregation against the pas-
tor and two others for an account-
ing of the balance of \$25,600 be-
tween the two sale prices.

A writ was filed late to-day at
Osgoode Hall by B. J. Spencer
Pitt on behalf of James M. Jack-
son, S. S. Scott, W. Waldron and
Lawrence Best, claiming to rep-
resent the other members against
Rev. T. H. Henderson, Naomi Pas-
co and Edith Johnson.

The writ asks for the return of
all moneys "unlawfully received
by the Rev. Henderson from the
proceeds and all moneys appropri-
ated from the said amount or ob-
tained unlawfully or by misrepres-
entation or fraud from this fund."

An injunction is asked to res-
train the defendants from issuing
cheques on the special funds from
the sale of the University Ave.
property now said to be on deposit
in the Dominion Bank, College
and Spadina Branch.
