**BILL**

*To regulate and grant, for a limited time, certain fees to the Clerks of the Markets, in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the Town of Three-Rivers.*

**W**HEREAS it is expedient to regulate the fees of the Clerks of the Markets, in the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and in the Town of Three-Rivers; Be it therefore enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of, and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act passed in the fourteenth year of His late Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Government of the Province of Quebec in North-America;*" and to make further provision for "the Government of the said Province;"— And it is hereby enacted by the authority of the same, that the Clerks of the Markets for the Cities of Quebec and Montreal, and Town of Three-Rivers, respectively, shall hereafter, for the several services here under-mentioned, be entitled to, and shall and may have and demand the following, and no other greater fee or fees, that is to say, for the weighing of every load of hay, currency; for weighing and stamping any cart or other viture, currency; for weighing any other article of country produce, not exceeding in weight ten pounds, currency; for weighing any such article of country produce, exceeding in weight ten, and not exceeding in weight one hundred pounds, currency; for weighing any such articles of country produce, exceeding in weight one hundred pounds, and not exceeding in weight two hundred pounds, currency; for weighing any such article of country produce, exceeding in weight two hundred pounds, and not exceeding in weight four hundred pounds, currency; for weighing any such article of country produce, exceeding in weight four hundred pounds, and not exceeding in weight six hundred pounds, currency; for every hoghead, not exceeding fifteen hundred weight, currency; for every anchor, not exceeding ten hundred weight, currency; for every cable, not exceeding in length sixty fathoms, currency; for every cable,
