

# Dirk Sterkin wins first under-21 contest

Dirk Sterkin finally tucked a victory under his belt last Sunday in the Ontario under-21 Developmental League. Sterkin, the newly-appointed coach of Clarkson Ruscher, had to

wait until his third game as coach for a win. Clarkson gave Sterkin the two points by edging Scar-

borough 2-1 at Scarborough.

"The players thought it was about time they gave me a win," said Sterkin. They started talking to each other at half time and saying let's get a goal for Dirk.

Clarkson did get a goal after being held 1-1 at half-time. Captain Peter Poulsen scored the

winner on a penalty.

"We're as good as any team in the league," said Sterkin, "but we keep playing as individuals and not as a team."

"Against Scarborough it was the first time (in three games) the guys have really talked and encouraged each other," he said. "This should be a pattern (for the following games)."

Ron Woltman scored Clarkson's first goal.

The win keeps Clarkson in fourth place with a 4-1 record.

In other under-21 play, Malton Hornets upset third place Melita 2-1 on goals by Steve Bennett and Jeff Peterson.

Malton Stingers took their first point of the season at the expense of North York Falcons, after

being three goals down. Stingers tied North York 5-5.

Tom Robb led the Stingers with two goals. Doug Kean, Eddy Scelinfeld and Tony Shelton scored one goal apiece.

In the Consols Cup at St. Clair Stadium, Stingers lost 3-2 to Toronto Sparks.

Cecil Bord scored both Malton goals.
