"By the scores of thousands, lit and eager young men of England, Australia, New Zealand and Canada have fallen in for wings parades since the great British Commonwealth Air Training Plan came into operation and production in 1940," Group Capt. W. R. Kingsland said in his address to graduating pilots at Uplands this afternoon. "And never since the plan came into production have there been too few crews too late for the aircraft produced for them to a man," he said proudly.

The commanding officer at Uplands, Group Capt. Kingsland stated it had been a triumph of planning and training that fully qualified aircrew were available to staff the expanding training organization, when new schools were being opened at the rate of one a week during the latter part of 1940.


Sgt. Barton, son of Mrs. Fred Barton, Prescott, enlisted in August, 1940, as an airplane mechanic and
