Ottawa, Sept. 24, 1909.

Dear Dr. Pugsley,-

I have received this morning a letter from Dr. Wilfred T. Grenfell, written from Harrington, Canadian Labrador. In his letter Dr. Grenfell says:-

"I have just come in here with the "Strathcona" and write to you as I find the wharf we so much need has not been begun. There is no public wharf at all in this growling place. I arrived with a whole cargo of Marconi men (ten) and all their heavy material for erecting a post. There is no wharf at which to land any of it.

Also there are here fifty casks of gasoline I sent to Canada for. There is no wharf to a get them off from, and it is almost impossible with this rough harbor in these S.W. winds to get them off the rocks without breaking them
