impossible. Certain forms must
be observed & these are always
made through the agency of
someone who will be respon-
sible for the act. Obedience to
illegal orders are is wrong when
commanded by the sov. If wrong
is done by misfortune inadvertence
misinformation etc it may be
redressed. The agent is responsible.

The sov. cannot dispense with
any thing which the law requires.
Penalties cannot be remitted by the
sov. which the law gives to a
party who has earned it. The
sov. cannot pardon a musician.
