

Mr. John Lekavy, accompanied by his wife and three children, arrived in Canada on April 17th, 1927, from Bojanowice Dolne, Moravia, Czechoslovakia. The Land Settlement Department of the Canadian National Railways directed this family to the Margo district in Saskatchewan, where Mr. Lekavy purchased a 160 acre farm (N.W. $\frac{1}{4}$ 15-34-10 West 2nd) at a price of \$3200 paying no cash down. Mr. Lekavy has now erected a house and stable on the farm.

Mr. Lekavy has now erected a house and stable on the farm. 10 acres have been broken during the past season, and he harvested 35 acres of wheat and 18 acres of oats. The truck garden will supply the family with vegetables for winter use. Mr. Lekavy has secured 3 horses, 2 cows, 1 heifer, 2 pigs together with farm equipment, consisting of mower,

plow, harrow and wagon, and the family express themselves as being well pleased with their new home.
