Ottawa, 18th March, 1915.

Sir:-

I am in receipt of your letter of the IIth instant, in which you ask whether the services of constable McCloy will be retained during the coming year, and in reply I beg to say that when you wrote you should have stated whether the constable is doing good work and whether you recommend the retention of his services. A full report in this connection is desired.

With regard to your statement that Mr. McCloy desires, in the event of his services being retained, to be allowed two rations or their equivalent in cash in addition to his salary of \$65.00 a month, I have to request that you will inform the Department definitely as to the value of the two rations. What amount would it be necessary to pay Mr. McCloy monthly in order to meet his request, provided he were allowed in cash the remuneration asked for?
