Receipt is acknowledged of your letter of July 5, 1955, with regard to the arrangements to be made for the forthcoming conference between senior officials of this Department and Indian delegates from the five Agencies located on the lower mainland coast and on Vancouver Island.

With regard to hotel reservations for yourself, I regret that the Hotels Georgia, Vancouver, and Devonshire were booked solid for the period desired. I did, however, reserve for you a double room, without bath, at the Grosvenor Hotel for the nights of July 19, 20, and 21 inclusive. This was all that was available, but I have asked the hotel to change this to a room with bath if any other reservations are cancelled. The management requests that you check in before 9.00 p.m. on July 19th, or else send them a deposit to hold the room for you. Rates, \$4.00 per day. I have, in addition, reserved for the eight Indian delegates from your Agency, two rooms at the St. Francis Hotel (opposite the C.P. Railway Station), and 6 rooms at the Niagara Hotel, on Pender just east of Richards. As I do not know who your delegates are to be, I have reserved these rooms in the name of the Department of Indian Affairs, and will leave it to you to billet your eight members as you see fit.
