Following the judgment of the "Conference of Bishops of the Anglican Communion, holden at Lambeth Palace in July, 1888," The Church Standard accepts and maintains the following Articles:—

- (a)—The Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments, as "containing all things necessary to salvation," and as being the rule and ultimate standard of faith.
- (b)—The Apostle's Creed, as the Baptismal Symbol; and the Nicene Creed, as the sufficient statement of the Christian faith.
- (c)—The two Sacraments as ordained by Christ himself—Baptism and the Supper of the Lord—ministered with unfailing use of Christ's words of institution, and of the elements ordained by Him.
- (d)—The Historic Episcopate, locally adapted in the methods of its administration to the varying needs of the nations and peoples called of GoD into the Unity of His Church.
