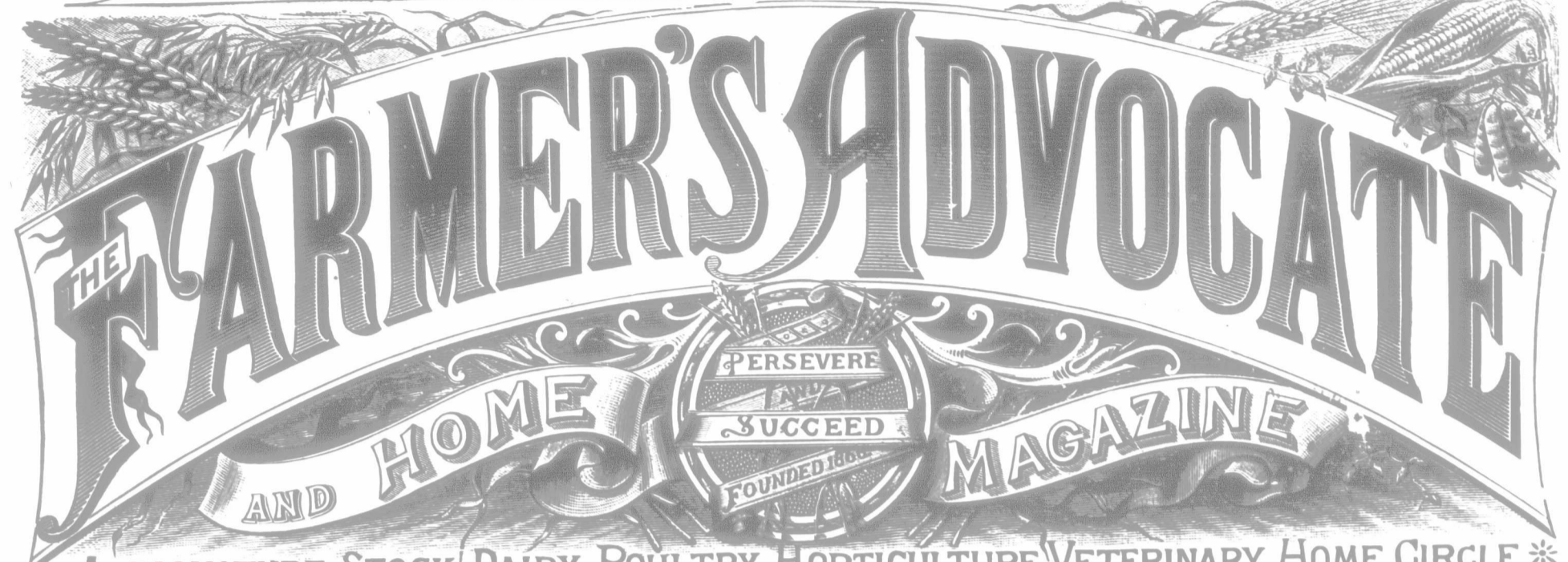

## A Battle of Giants.
