MEN TO ACCEPT... G.T.R. WAGE CUT... FOR TIME BEING

Tentative Agreement Reached... After Conference With... Company

MONTREAL, Oct. 26.—A... tentative agreement has been... reached between the employees of the Grand Trunk Railway and representatives of the company, whereby the men agree to accept provisionally the reduction in wages, with the understanding that if further negotiations alter the schedules of pay the company will see that any back money withheld is refunded.

The agreement arrived at is, in... a general way, that the employees... accept the reduced rates of pay put into effect in July last, subject to adjustment of pay in different classes.

The agreement was also subject... to a reopening of the whole question... of wage rates on 15 days' notice from either side, when any further reconsideration would be taken up by representatives of the company and the employees.

The reduction approximates 12... per cent. Should the reconsideration and conferences suggested as possible result in a disagreement of a permanent character, it was provided that the matter would then be referred to the Chairman of the Arbitration Board, J. M. Godfrey of Toronto, and the dispute would be taken up before this board until the case was referred back for settlement between the company and representatives of the employees. This is not regarded as likely and the agreement reached today is considered as paving the way to a settlement of the whole question. Further discussions will deal with rates of pay in different classes.
