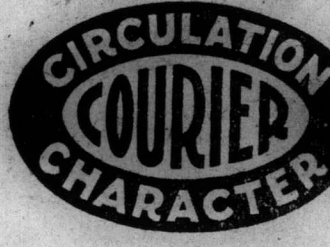

Puzzling Cases of War Fatigue

Malady of Soldier Presents Symptoms Resembling Other Ailments FAVORABLE FACTORS Sudden Break of Strong Man, Unwilling to Give Up, Really Due to Anticipation of Intoxication
The Paris correspondent of the Medical Record describes in detail an ailment which has often confused medical men of the armies of Europe, frequently being mistaken for one or another of half a dozen diseases, but which in reality, has turned out to be nothing more or less than extreme manifestation of war fatigue.

Danger to Strong Men

"One can readily understand that this man will soon break under the strain and be in the hospital; but the strong man this is the strong man, mentally and physically, who disdains fatigue, danger, meals, and sleep; he often presents a condition of which I shall speak and which it is my duty to report to the surgeon at the front-line hospital should be prepared to meet.

Synopsis of Canadian News
