LORD ROBERTS HONOR

The most Noble Order of the Garter, to which Lord Roberts has just been admitted by Her Majesty, was originally established by King Edward III. in 1349. As reconstituted in 1832 it is limited to the Sovereign, the Prince of Wales and such descendants of George I. as may be elected and to twenty-five Knight Companions: but Sovereigns and Princes of other realms and other foreigners of distinction may be admitted by special statutes. Its abbreviation is K. G., and it is the highest order of Knighthood. There is at present fifty members in all including the Queen. The vacancy which Lord Roberts will fill was created by the death of the Duke of Argyll.—Ex.

Collapse of Her Majesty, Queen Victoria

STRICKEN WITH PARALYSIS AT MIDNIGHT

COWES, Midnight, January 19.—The Queen lies at death's door.

She was stricken with paralysis to-night.

Reuter's telegram company understand that the Prince of Wales has received authority to act in Her Majesty's stead and thus has been created a practical, though not a constitutional regency.

LATEST BULLETINS

COWES, January 22nd, 5 a. m.—The Queen is expected to live until Thursday morning, unless unexpected complications occur.

COWES, Isle of Wight, January 21st, 4.33 p. m.—A slight improvement is said to be visible in the Queen's condition. But there is no hope of anything but a fatal ending. The night is awaited with the greatest anxiety. Paralysis is spreading to vital parts.

Nourishment is being artificially administered. The palace is packed. There is scarcely room for the emperor of Germany and his staff. With the exception of newspaper correspondents there are only a few people outside the gates. Inquiries from all parts of the world continue to pour in.

Nova Scotia Farmers' Association

The Annual Meeting of the above Association will open at Kentville, Kings County, Wednesday evening Jan. 30th at 7 o'clock and continue in session during the next two days. It is to be hoped that all of the one hundred and thirty Agricultural Societies in the Province will try and attend, as an excellent programme has been prepared and some interesting subjects will come up for discussion.

Among the visitors and speakers from outside the Province who are expected, are the Hon. Sydney Fisher, Minister of Agriculture, F. W. Hodson, Dominion Live Stock Commissioner, W. T. Macoun, Horticulturist at the Central Experimental Farm, Ottawa, and others. B. W. Chipman, Secretary of Agriculture for N. S.; Prof. H. M. Smith, of the School of Agriculture, Truro; R. Robertson, Superintendent of the Experimental Farm, Nappan; J. E. Hopkins, of the Dominion Dairy Station, at Nappan and Prof. Sears of the Horticultural College, Wolfville, will also be present and give short addresses.

Whilst C. C. H. Eaton, of Canada, will read a paper along the Beef line, Jno. Donaldson, of Port Williams, will read one bearing the Dairying; W. E. Roscoe, of Kentville, will present one relating to Roads; and D. Logan, of Pictou, and B. H. Lee, of Berwick, will take up Sheep and Swine raising, respectively; J. E. Wood, Secretary to the N. S. Exhibition Commission will also be there with a paper on Exhibition matters.

On Friday evening, it is expected through plans are not sufficiently developed to speak for certain, that a dinner in honor of the distinguished visitors from outside the Province will be held.
