SKETCH OF THE LIFE OF LYDIA E. PINKHAM

This remarkable woman, whose maiden name was Estes, was born in Lynn, Mass., February 26, 1819, coming from a good old Quaker family. For some years she taught school, and became known as a woman of an alert

and investigating mind, an earnest seeker after knowledge, and above all, possessed of a wonderfully sympathetic nature.



her mother, combined forces to restore the family fortune. They argued that the medicine which was so good for their women friends and neighbors was equally good for the women of the whole world.

The Pinkhams had no money, and little credit. Their first laboratory was the kitchen, where roots and herbs were steeped on the stove, gradually filling a gross of bottles. Then came the question of selling it, for always before they had been it away freely. They hired a job printer to run off some pamphlets setting forth the merits of the medicine, now called Lydia E. In 1873 the financial crisis struck Lynn. INSECT-INFESTED TIMBER FOR SALE

LARGE OFFERINGS BY UNITED STATES FOREST SERVICE IN BLACK HILLS RESERVE.

DEADWOOD, S. D., April 18.—The United States forest service is offering for sale in the Black Hills forest reserve, 250,000,000 feet of timber which is infested by the bark beetle. The greatest ever waged against a small insect in this western country has been bravely fought by the forestry department, which has at last been obliged to admit it self vanquished by a little beetle from one-sixth to one-fourth of an inch in length. The only salvation now for the remaining timber is to remove as rapidly as possible all infested timber so that the beetles may die before infesting the sound trees. To this end, the department offers for sale this immense amount of timber in the southern part of the Hills. This does not by any means represent the total amount of damaged timber, as that on patented land, valid mineral or agricultural claims, and on areas about to be sold, is enormous. It is hoped that the government to sell this timber in large amounts to operators who will handle it on a large scale, as the country in which most of it is located is accessible.

MEXICO APPOINT CONSUL

FAVORABLE TRADE OUTLOOK BETWEEN CANADA AND SOUTHERN REPUBLIC.

VICTORIA, B. C., April 18.—To cope with the establishment of the new Canadian-Mexican Pacific Steamship Line, the Mexican government has decided to appoint a consul at Vancouver. His duty will be to protect Mexican interests in that city.

The steamer Georgia, which will inaugurate the new service is calling at no intermediate port since she left Iquique on the 21st ult., and is expected to reach Victoria during the present week. After staying here for a few days, she will commence loading her cargo for the initial trip.

It was stated some time ago that the Victoria Machinery Depot had secured the contract for repairing the vessels of the new fleet. Captain Worsnop, the general manager for the new concern in British Columbia, says that no such contract has been awarded to the depot. When repairs are necessary the vessels will be docked at Esquimalt, but it is not yet known to what firm the work will be given. The Georgia will not be docked on her arrival here.

The new enterprise will have its headquarters at Victoria, and Captain Worsnop, the general manager, is taking up his residence here. The head office of the local transit and freight agent, J. H. Greer, will also be in Victoria. With the exception of the time when the vessels are loading and discharging at the Terminal City, they will lie at Victoria.

Preparations are proceeding apace for joining up the line with the Atlantic seaboard of Mexico and the Old Country. This will considerably shorten the transit of goods from England to British Columbia, and at present come either via the Horn or the Orient. A fleet of steamers will ply between the Atlantic terminus of the Tehuantepec route and London and Liverpool in the Old Country. A satisfactory arrangement has been entered into between the new steamship line and the inter-oceanic railway, with the result that freight can be carried at a greatly reduced rate. Details of this arrangement have not been made public, but as President Diaz is largely interested in the line it is understood to be commensurate to a subsidy from the government of Mexico.

With the linking up of the two projected steamship lines by the Tehuantepec railroad, goods can be brought to British Columbia from the Old Country in a little over a month's time. By the Blue Funnel liners they take upwards of two months, and by vessels coming via the Horn the time is from four months upwards. In the latter cases it is only sailing vessels that make the journey. For nearly twenty years, as far as this province is concerned, would seem to be doomed.

The new enterprise, too, has ramifications. It will give the trade of the Old Country with Mexico a much needed impetus. That trade has been on the decrease for some time past and the Old Country has been outstripped by Germany, chiefly owing to the fact that the established steamship lines with Mexico, for British Columbia in particular, and Canada in general, are in the hands of a most optimistic character.

With the immense capital by which the new enterprise is backed, it is likely that the course of time, commencing to exploit the coal and lumber resources of the province. It is certain at least that the future years will see a big increase in the trade returns of the Dominion, largely due to the new enterprise, which is now being inaugurated. With the exception of the enterprise ports of call will be made in Europe, while every port of any importance along the coast will be included in the schedule of the line. Freight and passenger agents have already been secured. Arrangements for what accommodations have been made. Enquiries are flowing in from all over the province and from the far east, of the Dominion, as well as from Mexico.

C.P.R. MAY HAVE TO TAKE OVER NORTH LINE OF C.N.R.

WINNIPEG, April 19.—Mr. Frank Dillinger, special representative of the Railway Commission in the West, this morning wired to the Commission to the effect that the only method of securing relief for shippers and other patrons of the Canadian Northern railway would be to request the Canadian Pacific Railway to take over at once the operation of the Regina branch of the Canadian Northern formerly operated by the Canadian Pacific.

There are at the present time 3.2 engines of the Canadian Northern on the Prince Albert branch. If the operation of this branch was taken over by the Canadian Pacific these 22 engines, in excellent condition, would be at once released for use on other portions of the C.N.R.

LONGBOAT MAY BE DISQUALIFIED

DANGER OF CANADA'S HOPE AT BOSTON MARATHON BEING DEBARRED.

TORONTO, April 18.—The Star says: That Tom Longboat, the Indian runner, is in very serious danger of disqualification by the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States, and disbarment from the great Boston Marathon is made plain by a wire from Mr. John J. Dixon, of New York, secretary of the Amateur Athletic Union of the United States.

The Star wired this morning asking for the exact state of affairs of the great Ontario, on whom athletic Canada pins her hopes in the big race. The reply follows:

"Sporing Editor, Star, Toronto, Ont.: 'Cannot decide until Canadian Association furnishes me with information asked for, when our registration committee will decide. (Signed) John J. Dixon.'

The wire makes it clear that Longboat's Canadian Amateur Athletic Union certificate of purity will not be enough, and that a full explanation will be insisted upon before the Indian is allowed to start.

With only one day intervening before the great race is to start, it is easy to see that Longboat is going to have his troubles. That it is an act of reprisal for the C.A.A.U. refusal to let Longboat start against Nabrick, of Buffalo at New York, last month, is the consensus of opinion here and there are those who will say that the United States authorities will play the hand through, and keep Longboat out of the big event. CO-OPERATION A SUCCESS IN IOWA

STATE IS AT HEAD OF FARMERS' MOVEMENT—200 SOCIETIES ORGANIZED.

MASON CITY, April 18.—"There have been fifty farmers' co-operative societies organized in northern Iowa since the Fort Dodge convention last January," said Edward E. Dunn of this city, an organizer of farmers' societies for this section of Iowa.

"I myself have organized nineteen societies," said Mr. Dunn. "The sentiment seems to be increasing instead of decreasing, notwithstanding the report of the active war against such organizations on the part of the grain association."

Further in the conversation Mr. Dunn said that there were now in Iowa over 200 active farmers' corporations of the mutual character, doing a successful business.

The average capital stock of these societies is placed by Mr. Dunn at \$6,000. Some of the societies organize with a capital stock of \$15,000.

All the societies were doing a thrifty and successful business. Iowa is now at the head of the co-operative movement among the farmers, and it is estimated that over \$2,000,000 is invested in property of this character by the farmers in Iowa alone. That more of these societies will be organized the coming six months than ever before is the belief of those interested.

IMMIGRANT ROBBED BY TWO STRANGERS

ACCOMPANIED THEM TO A ROOM IN LONDON, ONT., AND WAS RELIEVED OF MONEY.

LONDON, Ont., April 18.—Misplaced confidence in a pair of absolute strangers resulted disastrously last night to a young man who had just arrived in the city from England.

The immigrant reached London on a late Grand Trunk train from the east, in company with another immigrant and his six children. The new arrivals had no friends here and knowing nothing about the city they decided to spend the night in the railway depot. Hardly had they laid down on the benches, than they were accosted by two young men well dressed and apparently respectable, who told the immigrants to go with them and they would be secured comfortable quarters for the night. The new arrival, with the family, refused to leave the station, but his companion did not appreciate sleeping on a bench and he went with the "strangers."

Where they took him he does not know except that the place appeared to be an attic. He was given a bed and a glass of beer. He was not long in the morning when he awoke the immigrants found that his so-called friends were gone, and that his money—about five pounds—had also disappeared. The cash had been placed in the owner's stocking for safe keeping, but his whereabouts had been discovered.
