Reception to Mr. C. R. McIntosh

On Friday evening last the of St Paul's congregation and Sabbath school, with other friends, gathered in the basement of the church to bid farewell to Mr C R. McIntosh, who has resigned the principalship of the Athens model school to accept a similar osition in Pertb. An interesting impromptu programme was rendered and refreshments served. During the evening an address was read to Mr McIntosh by the minister of the congregation. Mr McIntosh in replying to the address made a fine speech, setting forth the principles according to which be had tried to conduct his work and expressing his thanks for the good wishes and kind words of the

The address was as follows :--

Mr C. R. McIntosh. Dear Friend, The occasion that calls us together this evening is one to which there are many parallels in life. Again and again we find ourselves called to say farewell to triends and fellow-helpers. These changes and partings cannot but give rise to feelings akin to sadness, yet we shall do well to remember the words of a great poet and wise man, "Rejoice that man is hurled from change to change un nnceasingly, His soul's wings never

It is not to much too say that during your six years' stay in Athens the village has benefited very materially by your works. Several generations o pupils will in days to come rise up and call you blessed. We have all admired your foriginality and independence, your dislike of mere seeming at the expense of being, your enthusiasm and unfaltering fidelity to your ideas. We must also mark the fact that you have been able to control your pupils with-out recourse to physical force, your discipline having been of that higher type which results from what may be described as power of personality. We are thankful too that as Principal of the Model and Public school you have consistently endeavoured to instil the principles of Canadianism, to school your pupils in patriotism, and to fit them in mind and feeling and temper to be good citizens of our fair Do-It is our sincere opinion that from all the most important points in view your work as a teacher in Athens must be regarded as an unqualified

There is another feature of your life amongst us to which we must now refer. As members and adherents of the Church which you yourself belong, we desire to put upon record our appreciation of your kind and faithful Christian service. As a Bible Class Teacher and teacher of other classes you have been zealous and efficient. You have tried to be true to the past, as the past is pictured in the pages of Scripture, and yet true also to present needs; you have felt great reverence for the inspiration vouchsafed to men of old and yet mindful of the inspiration that may come to men to day. Again, as a member of the Church you have been faithful and diligent. You have been present at nearly all our sessions of worship, an intelligent and sympathetic hearer. Your habits of lite before the world have been clean and honorable so that no one has been discouraged or perplexed or made ashamed by reason of your example. In a word, we would say that your connection with our beloved Church and St. Paul's congregation has been entirely honorable to yourself and helpful to all who have been associated

Finally we pray that the Divine blessing may go with you in your new and larger field of work. We are glad that though you are leaving us you will not be lost to the Church or to Canada. We congratulate you on having taken what seems to us a step forward. It is to your credit that to many other good qualities you join that of healthy enterprise and praise worthy ambition. You are not content to be one of those "ebbing men" as Shakespeare calls them, who...."do so near the bottom run, By their own fear or sloth," and we rejoice that such

is the temper of your mind. Let us inscribe as a parting word these expressions of Scripture which very truly represent our feelings:

The Lord watch between thee and us. The Lord bless thee and keep thee: The Lord make His face to shine upon thee, and be gracious unto thee: The Lord lift up His countenance upon thee and give thee peace.
