RECKLESS BOY WITH GUN.
Fills Young Indian Lad's Mouth and Breast With Fine Shot.
Guelph, May 21.—Last evening in Brooklyn, a suburb of the city, some lads were in an empty house, and one of them, named Wakefield, picked up a shot gun which was there. Just at that time Frank Miller, a young Indian lad, approached the door and, pointing the gun at him, Wakefield ordered him to stop or he would shoot.
Whether Wakefield did not know the gun was loaded or did not appreciate the consequences is not known, but the shotgun was discharged and a good deal of the contents lodged in Miller's breast and mouth.
Luckily the weapon was loaded with fine shot only, and the medical authorities found that they had not penetrated very deeply into the flesh.
The police authorities are inclined to think no malice was intended.

WEI-HAI-WEI TO BE HELD.
Great Britain Will Retain Port at the Request of Japan.
London, May 21.—Rumors that Great Britain would soon evacuate Wei-Hai-Wei are now definitely denied.
Such a step is now impossible, Japan having expressed a desire that Great Britain hold that port in the interest of her ally.

It was said Saturday at the Foreign Office that any idea which Great Britain may have had of returning Wei-Hai-Wei to China has been dissipated.

IRONCLAD SINKS VESSEL.
Captain and One Sailor of Norwegian Sailing Craft Drown.
Kiel, Germany, May 21.—The coast defense ironclad Frithof Saturday ran down in a fog and sank off this port the Norwegian sailing vessel Othello. The captain of the Othello and one of her crew were drowned.

A Fiend of a Woman.
Tonawanda, May 21.—A strange woman, dressed in black and wearing a veil, stopped in front of the residence of Charles Brown, a building contractor, Saturday, and gave each of his children, a boy and a girl, 4 and 3 years of age, respectively, an ounce bottle containing enough carbolic acid to kill several adults, and urged the little ones to drink of their contents. The curiosity of the children caused them to sip the contents. The acid burned the children terribly and they have since been in a critical condition.

Forced Sister to Drown.
Chattanooga, Tenn., May 21.—Five persons, all connected with one of the prominent families of James County, were drowned Saturday in the Tennessee River. A lad of 18 years escaped by clinging to the overturned boat. The boat capsized on account of a sudden squall. Mrs. Edgar Miles, his sister, clung to him until in desperation he forced her to release her hold.

Earthquake Helped "Cupid."
San Francisco, May 21.—San Francisco can boast of a new marriage license record. In the month since the disaster on April 18, exactly 418 couples appeared before "Cupid" Munson, and, after depositing the necessary \$2, received the requisite paper. The total is eighteen more than have ever been issued in a calendar month in the history of the city.

Toronto Men to Build.
New York, May 21.—A contract was signed Saturday whereby J. G. White & Co., a New York engineering firm, are to build a high speed interurban line, costing \$2,000,000, between Rochester and Lockport for a syndicate representing Frederick Nicholls, E. R. Wood and Sir Henry M. Pellatt of Toronto. The contract covers complete construction. Work will begin immediately.

Labor Leader Dead.
Boston, May 21.—George E. McNeill, well known throughout the country for many years as a labor leader and a writer on economic subjects, died in the Somerville Hospital Saturday night, after undergoing an operation. He was born at Amesbury, Mass., in 1837.

Bodies Washed Ashore.
Cleveland, O., May 21.—The bodies of two seamen were washed ashore near the breakwater here Saturday. From lake seamen's cards found in the pockets, they were identified as Alfred Brunke of Detroit, Mich., and Charles A. Freese, Newcastle, Pa.

Two Deaths From Heat.
New York, May 21.—Two deaths and several serious prostrations from heat were reported here Saturday. The official thermometer stood at 85 degrees most of the afternoon, but on the street the mercury rose to 90 above.

HONOR DEAD HEROES.
Niagara District Memorial to Those Who Fell in South African War.
St. Catharines, May 21.—The church parade of the garrison and the unveiling of the memorial to the men of the Niagara district who fell in the South African war took place yesterday morning. It also marked the opening of the ceremonies in connection with the official opening of St. Catharines' armory. The services were held in the armory, and consisted of hymns and prayers read by Rev. N. L. Perry, chaplain of the 2nd Dragoons, and a sermon by Rev. Rural Dean Ker, chaplain of the 19th Regiment.

Lord Aylmer, commander of the Canadian militia, was on hand, and expressed pleasure upon being able to take part. He reviewed the deaths of the heroes whose memories are being commemorated.

The bronze tablet was then unveiled by Mrs. Campbell, wife of Lieut.-Col. Campbell, of the 19th Regiment. The names inscribed on the tablet are: Lieut. John E. Burch, Private Archibald MacLiffe, Private Henry Higgins, Gunner Jameson Black, Corporal Robert Irwin and Major Henry M. Arnold.

Work Train Is Wrecked.
Hagerstown, Md., May 21.—Three men were killed, two are missing and 15 others were more or less injured as the result of the wreck of a work train 43 miles west of here on the Western Maryland Railroad Saturday evening.
