**WHY I AM A PROHIBITIONIST.**

1. Because I desire to suppress the poison, which I look upon as the greatest political, social and moral curse of the age.
2. Because Prohibition seems to me the only method by which this can be accomplished.
3. Because the license system implies, for a money consideration, the granting a privilege to engage in what is an acknowledged evil.
4. Because to license is to throw around the protection of the law, and establish and protect by the law the very evil which I desire to suppress.
5. Because if it is an evil, money and license cannot make it right.
6. Because to grant a monopoly, for money or through favoritism, is contrary to right and to the spirit of our institutions.
7. Because if keeping a saloon is a legitimate business, all persons who desire and have means should be allowed to engage in it.
8. Because I cannot conscientiously support either of the parties which favor and sustain the saloon.
9. Because moral suasion alone, unaided by law, will never suppress the saloon.
10. Because public opinion will never be educated to the point of Prohibition so long as the saloon is licensed and protected by law.
11. Because from the saloon emanates the greater part of the crime, as well as the miseries of life, nearly all of which would disappear with enforced Prohibition of the liquor traffic.
12. Because if by my vote a saloon is established, and crime and misery and death ensue, I become a participator in the crime, and in a measure responsible for the result.—Prohibitionist, in Connecticut Home.

**IT WILL RUIN BUSINESS:**

Is the assertion true? Let us have a little talk over it and find out, if possible, *why* and *what* it will injure.

1. Will the aggregate of mankind and unwholeness of the community be injured if the liquor shops are shut?
- If he holds enough to make such an assertion? Surely the drunken neighbor is not better than the sober one; the tipping workman than the sober one; the dissipated clerk to be preferred to the abstemious one. No man would think his children robbed of anything necessary to their perfection, if he drank were not plentifully supplied. Does the rumshop help a man to be more many, or a woman to be more womanly? Does it implant motives to industry, principles to economy, teach lessons of self-respect, add any moral impulse, or inspire with any spiritual fervor? Nay! not so.—The rumshop gives drunken citizens, unreliable workmen, tramping employees, teaches idleness, and want of thrift; debases and degrades wherever it has influence and gets custom. It manufactures three-quarters of our criminals; more than half our paupers; destroys innumerable homes and spreads misery in every quarter.
- Is all this good for trade? Does business flourish best when citizens are debased, degraded and ruined? The young one knows that an honest industrious citizenship is the very basis of all prosperity and business advancement. And everybody knows that the open rumshop is the relentless enemy of honesty, morality and industry in any community.
- Then vote out the rumshop and give our manhood a chance to come to its best. *Will the various occupations be interfered with if we close the liquor shops? NOT ONE.*
- Yonder is a carpenter's shop, with its dozen workmen. No material, or ornament, or tool is rendered more difficult to obtain, no muscle is made less strong, no brain less clear, no hand less skillful because the rumshop is closed; the sound of plane, saw and mallet is heard all the day and the workmen are busy and happy. Now open the rum-shop beside it. How long before confusion appears; there it is the material, the tools, all there, but now, brain less clear, his will to work is less strong.—By and by a place is vacant at the work bench, and a place is filled at the tipping bench.
- "Where's the boy to-day?" inquires the stove founder, as he comes in and finds a place vacant.
- "He is not around sir, he was drunk last night," answers his fellow workman. And so the whole work of the foundry must be retarded because the rumshop has been helping the workman on one of the sets.
- "Has the cutter come in yet?" asks the master tinner, as he looks over his long list of measurements.
- "No sir," replies the clerk, "we shall see him for two or three days." And the master tinner is so thankful for the kind-ly aid of the rumshop.
- There is in fact, no single industry which is not hampered or hindered by the interferences of the rumshop. Let us vote it out and give our industries an opportunity to do their best.
- Will the demand for articles of trade be lessened if the shops are shut?

Who buys most groceries and dry goods furniture and clothing? The drinking or the sober working man? They stand on Saturday night, each with his week's wages; the sober man comes to your store and lays out all his earnings in necessities and comfort for his family; the drinking man walks past your store and wastes half or more of his earnings in drunken debauch, and yet you wonder if prohibition won't hurt your business! Can't you see that every rumshop competes with you for these wages, and what it gets you lose.

The rumshops of Ontario in 1879 fitted over 3,000 citizens for the prison and sent them there. Does it help business to take 3,000 workers and consumers out of the ranks of labor and set them down inside prison walls to be supported by the taxes of the country?

The 4,000 rumshops of Ontario gathered up from the public last year, not less than \$4,000,000; not less than half of that amount, or \$2,000,000, would have gone for articles of legitimate trade, had these shops been shut. Does it help business to have over \$2,000,000 yearly pass by the traders and lose itself utterly in the waste of the dram shop? Are the pauper good customers? Yet the rumshops are burdening us with a continually increasing population, who, in addition to producing and consequently spending nothing are to be kept upon the proceeds of honest industry.

"How much is a good laboring man's custom worth to you per year, my trading friend?"

Well, if I had all of his custom, it would amount to about \$400 per year.

"Now, would you be so kind as to refer me if I should turn my custom from you for twenty years?" "No, for that would keep \$8,000 out of the aggregate of my trade."

"Well, ought you to be much obliged to the Rumshop who kills off or paralyzes, or criminalizes a man at 22 years of age and thus destroys a fair certainty of 20 years of custom to legitimate trade? And yet they are doing this every day. O, yes, the rumshops increase the demand for articles of trade by killing off and paralyzing the people!"

We do not need such aids in business.

But the business will leave us and go elsewhere.

What business? Will the people eat less meat, groceries, or drink? Will they wear less shoes, hats and clothes? Will they buy less furniture and carriages? No, they will move more of these. Then such business will not leave us, but will be more prosperous than before. Shall we need fewer books and papers, pictures and paintings, less gardening and planting, carpentering and boat building? No.—Will the school teachers and preachers desert us? Not much. What business then? The rum business.

The business of making criminals would not be so brisk, and it is quite possible that the saloon would be seen on our streets, and an air of strange quiet would reign about the police courts, but we surely need not cry if the criminal making business goes elsewhere. The pauper making business would receive its death blow, and most men could then earn their own living; but surely we shall not mourn its departure.

There would be a perceptible lull in the wide beating business; but then we could survive that.

The business of demoralizing the young by open temptations, by frequent examples of vice carried on, and by the worst of associations would sadly diminish, but not be entirely destroyed.

Alas! this talk of losing business. Every business worth having will do. Every business that we would be glad to lose, will go with us.

for the town of Newcastle in the County of Northumberland.

That your petitioners are informed and believe that a Board of Health has been appointed about the same time for the town of Chatham in the said County.

That during the last sitting of the Local Legislature an Act was passed entitled the Public Health Act of 1887.

That under the provisions of that Act all Boards of Health are continued until a new Board is appointed by the Municipal Council of the County and that the Government have power to divide the Province into Health Districts and under that provision have made the County of Northumberland a health district.

That your petitioners as such Board of Health caused the annexed Notices to be printed and distributed among the Property holders and occupiers of Land in the Town of Newcastle.

That your petitioners noticed after the date mentioned in the said notice.

That certain owners of land questioned the power and authority of your petitioners to enforce the provisions of the Health Act of 1887 on the following grounds. 1st. That Northumberland was established a Health District under the said Act. 2nd. That Chatham and Newcastle both had Boards of Health established at the same time and it was questioned which Board of Health could act under the Act.

Your petitioners therefore pray that this Council would memorialize the Government to make the town of Chatham and the town of Newcastle separate Health Districts under the Public Health Act of 1887, and when the Government shall do so to appoint a Board of Health for the town of Newcastle.

Your petitioners would also call the attention of this Council to the pool of water in rear of the buildings on the North side of Prince Street, in Newcastle, and would ask this Council to instruct the road commissioner for the town of Newcastle to drain the same, year petitioners would be most obliged if the owner can be compelled to do so.

Com. Adams thought the proper course would have been to have had a special act passed at the House of Assembly and not put the county to the expense of having a bill prepared and introduced. In reference to the pool of water alluded to he thought the surveyor of roads for the town of Newcastle should attend to it.

Motion was made that the petition be not received.

Com. Smith thought it should be referred to the committee on petitions and that the petitioners be notified.

Com. McKean presented petition of Arthur Wright asking for relief of taxes; also referred to Com. on petitions.

Com. McKean presented petition of Trustees of Schools, Newcastle, as follows:

Com. McKean, Esq., Councilor, Newcastle, N. B.

DEAR SIR:

At a meeting of the Board of Trustees of Schools, District No. 7, Parish of Newcastle, held on the 20th it was Resolved: That the councilors for the County of Northumberland, in session convened, be requested to sell at public auction for the benefit of the school district, the property known as the old grammar school, situate in the town of Newcastle, and that Com. McKean be asked to present our request.

I beg to say in support of the above resolution that we are unable to keep the school house and all the school property in the town of Newcastle, because unwilling to make improvements on property to which we can lay no claim.

Com. McKean made some explanations in reference to this matter.

The Sec. Treas. read articles of Act of Assembly 1873, in which year an act was passed respecting the lot of land referred to in the petition, and stated that it was quite common for this Council to order the sale of this land. Com. Smith and McKean spoke as to the facts of the case, and on motion it was referred to the committee on petitions.

Com. McKean brought up an old petition presented to the Council by Alex. Cummings at January sittings, 1886, praying that he be relieved from the payment of taxes, being over sixty years of age.

The Sec. Treas. read report of Committee on Petitions, and on 17th January, 1886, this report recommending that he be exempted from that date, which report was received and adopted.

Com. Smith thought the report which was final and he objected to having it again brought up.

Com. McKean moved that the petition be taken from the Council and be recommended by the petitioner was entitled to a refund of taxes paid and he should get it. The motion was not seconded.

Com. Smith was of opinion that there should be some justification of the course proposed by the mover before the council voted to take up this matter again.

Com. McKean brought up the case of R. D. Robinson, disposed of in a former sitting in reference to charges in moving him to the Asylum, and conveyed that R. D. Robinson be heard in reference thereto. Carried.

Mr. Robinson being present stated that his bill had been cut down \$30.00, on which particular item he did not know. There were certain charges included in the bill for which he had paid cash and he wished to know whether they had taken it off his charges per day for his services or elsewhere.

On motion the matter was referred to committee on County accounts.

Com. Adams brought up the petition of the widow Russell, which had been referred back to the councilors for the Parish of Alnwick, they to confer with the assessors. The statements in the petition were correct, and the councilors would recommend that she be refunded the sum of \$25.00, over taxed, and he so moved. Carried.

Com. Underhill presented petition of Mr. Clark asking for refund of taxes, he having been made to pay to two parishes. Referred to committee on petitions.

On motion Council adjourned until 4 o'clock.

Council called to order at 4 o'clock.

Com. Smith moved that the Sec. Treas. pay Chatham Lock-up Committee the sum of \$92.00. Carried.

Com. Adams moved that Vital Allan be appointed Inspector of Fish and Aquatic Culture, suitable for the Parish of Alnwick. Passed.

On petition of Board of Health committee found that, under Act of Assembly of 1887 Council had appointed a Board of Health for the County of Northumberland. Passed as recommended.  
On petition of Trustees Schools committee recommended that the property be improved and proceeded appropriated under the provisions of the Act of Assembly of 1873. Passed as recommended by committee, and also recommended that the Sec. Treas. be empowered to sell the property at public auction.  
On petition of R. R. Call committee recommended that the petition be left in the hands of the committee in order that they may make further enquiry into its merits than they now have opportunity of doing, and that if upon thorough investigation they find that Mr. Call is holding a lot of land which he is entitled to, and at a loss they be empowered by Council to make such reduction as they may deem just, such action by them if taken, however, to have effect for one year only.  
Com. McKean presented a petition for amendment of the committee and moved in amendment that the rent be fixed at \$150 per year.  
Com. Esion, Ryan and Smith spoke to the report of the committee and in favor of adopting their recommendation. Amendment withdrawn and recommendation of committee adopted.
