pointed to look after this pool for license business.

Coun. Swin was fully in accord with the suggestion of Coun. McColl and thought it would be a benefit to the county if such an officer was appointed.

Coun. Campbell moved that a committee of three be appointed to deal with the question. Coun. I. Coates, McColl, Swin and Davidson were appointed such committee.

Coun. Morrison from special committee appointed at the special meeting to audit the books and accounts of the late Sec. Treas. reported that they had carefully perused the books and found them correct and the business in a satisfactory condition. Appended to his report was a long statement of accounts, etc.

On motion this report was received and adopted.

Coun. Davidson said that this committee which are performing the duties imposed on them so thoroughly and well, and Sec. Treas. at least deserved a vote of thanks from the Council in recognition of their services.

Coun. Sullivan moved that the thanks of the council be tendered to this committee for the very efficient manner in which they performed the duties entrusted upon them.

Coun. Anderson in seconding this thought that as this committee had gone to considerable work and trouble that perhaps they should receive more than a simple vote of thanks in remuneration.

The vote of thanks was passed unanimously and was tendered by the warden.

Coun. Allan moved that a committee of three be appointed to apportion an amount to remunerate these gentlemen for their services. Carried. Coun. Allan, Pond and Swin were appointed such committee.

Coun. Watt read the Scott Act Report as follows:

SCOTT ACT REPORT.

I, John Monies, Inspector under the C. T. Act in and for the County of Northumberland beg leave to submit my report for the year A. D. 1904.

During this year twelve prosecutions were commenced before the late Police Magistrate Niven. Four of these were dropped owing to the death of the Police Magistrate during the pendency of the cases.

Since the appointment of the present Police Magistrate Mr. Justice Davidson, eight prosecutions were commenced, resulting in six convictions and of these five of the fines were collected with costs.

The death of the late Mr. Justice Niven and the long lapse of time during which I was unable to get any tribunal to deal with offences under the Act, has caused the past year to be a very difficult period to enforce the law and I regret to have to report that I have not been satisfactory to myself or the county in this respect.

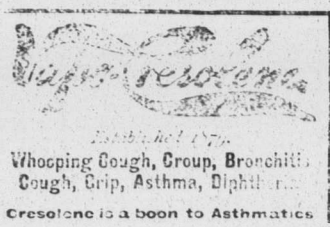
REPORT OF COMMITTEE.

Your committee has examined Inspector Monies' statement of account and expenses in connection with the Scott Act and find a very poor showing of only twenty prosecutions have been commenced during the year of which eleven convictions were secured. We would hail with pleasure this failure to institute prosecutions were we satisfied there was a corresponding lack of violation of the law, but we have reason to believe that liquor selling in joints of the county goes largely unchecked.

The Inspector's travelling account amounting to \$228.11 your committee considers out of reason and would recommend that the sum of \$150 be paid him in full settlement for this account and in future would recommend a sum not to exceed \$125 be annually allowed the Inspector for travelling expenses in connection with Scott Act cases.

We find that the result of last year's operations turn out as follows:

Boudle was a member, had not by a resolution, in reference to an account reported by the Public Works Committee, which was a great injustice to that committee and before making a motion he would like to have an explanation from Coun. Morrison as to his part in this matter.

The report referred to was one in reference to a motion made to public what in which a quantity of bones, dead and spikes were used. The Committee in their recommendation stated that in future the Public Works Committee should be made responsible for the bones and spikes by the Reg. They did not indicate how the bones and spikes were to be disposed of. They thought the Public Works Committee was in the interest of individuals rather than in the interest of the county.

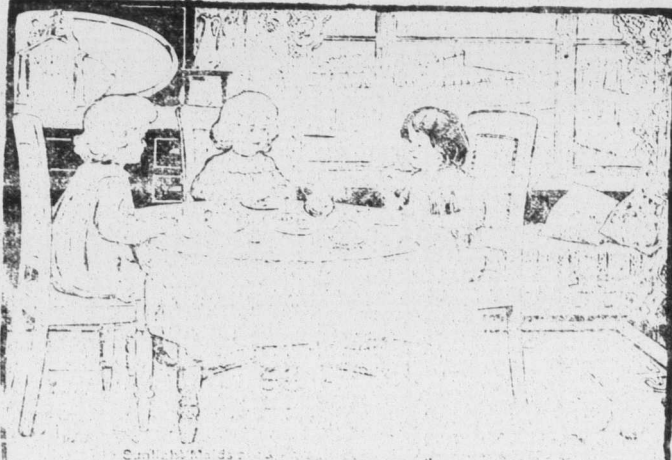
