BRASIL.

Mails are received with additional details of the great naval victory of the Portuguese squadron.

Both sides exhibited great heroism, and he slaughter is described as terrific. The Battle occurred three leagues below City of Corrientes, and the Portuguese lost 300 men, 60 evening.
