### Fears the Knife.

**Special Evening Telegram.**  
**PARIS, To-day.**  
The tension of the Balkan situation is thought at the Foreign Office among diplomats, shows slight slackening. It is a hard fact however that the danger from martial enthusiasm remains. It is realized the crisis will persist as long as millions of troops are spilling for a fight and continue under arms. Over optimism therefore is discouraged, but it is pointed out Russia and Austria when really united can go far in the Balkan States. There appears to be the belief that the Governments of both Turkey and the Balkan coalition might not necessarily their peoples, are still amenable to pressure from European powers. The combined ultimatum demanding big reforms, which the Balkan States were to have dispatched to Turkey has now, under the guidance of diplomacy, taken the form of a note, which will be sent simultaneously to all the Great Powers and Turkey. The Ottoman Government which protested that it would not listen to proposals touching its internal affairs from any source, has attacked the door to receive the demands of the Powers and intended to make by a voluntary grant of Christian Vilayets, a wholesale measure of reforms. Official France has noted the signs of concession as hopeful. The Government thinks, with some extension and an adequate guarantee that the Powers themselves will take a hand in their accomplishment, these reforms ought even to satisfy Bulgaria. It is believed Serbia, Greece and Montenegro will easily be induced to accept, but there is not the same confidence that the Bulgarian Government will be able to control the war fever which has clutched the people of that country. Threats are already heard that King Ferdinand will risk his crown if the shows signs of weakening. He remarked on an occasion of a previous upheaval "I shall maintain peace as long as I can without exposing my self to the stab of a knife." Recognition of the fact that danger threatens the King of Bulgaria is now providing a check to the optimism which diplomats would otherwise be inclined to give the rein.

## WAR Has Been Declared.

### HEAVY FIGHTING ON THE FRONTIER.

**Special Evening Telegram.**  
**CETTINGE, To-Day.**  
Motenegro declared war on Turkey this morning. The declaration of war was delivered by the Montenegrin Charge d'Affaires at the Porte early this morning. Heavy fighting is in progress along the frontier.

### A Thrilling Experience.

The schr. Elsie Butt arrived at Montserrat's South, St. Sunday, with 5000 lbs. fish from Flat islands. T. B. The vessel narrowly escaped being lost at Cock Head Tickle, Labrador, and Captain Butt and his crew had the terrible experience of seeing two men drown before their eyes without being able to extend a helping hand to them. Two others who were also drowning were saved after great difficulty and hardship by men from the shore, were hours unconscious and are yet in the hospital at Indian Harbour. This was the same night in which the Messrs. Dave and other fishermen were lost, and Capt. Butt with his five men of a crew, his daughter and little boy, aged 14 years, when they saw the tempest gradually becoming worse and the sea rapidly rising they decided to leave in their boat which as they approached the shore was almost swamped on several occasions. Some distance off the beach the boat was swept on a reef and dashed to pieces. All were hrow into the water, and they managed to reach the bottom more dead than alive and waded ashore where they were cared for by the people there. Their craft rode out the storm safely and they boarded her next day.

### Dredge is Wanted Here

That the dredging of the coves along the water front, especially in the western part of the harbor is necessary, is evident to all who work there or have business on the different wharves. The coves have filled rapidly with silt and all kinds of offal coming down into them from the city sewers and at low tide and in hot weather, strong robust men working on the wharves have become ill by inhaling the effluvia emitted from these places. An incident which occurred yesterday will go to prove that our contention is correct. A steamer was hauled well into the cove between Franklin's and Tessier's wharves and when most of the cargo had been put into her forward she sank several feet in the ooze there. A tug was trying to get her out yesterday afternoon for hours, but could not do so and the last expedient was, to take most of the cargo out of her forward to lighten when she was worked out into deeper water. This created a deal of expense which would be unnecessary if the cove were to be deepened. If the coves are not attended to there will be an outbreak of some dangerous disease in the city before long.

An outbreak of diphtheria has occurred at Torbay. Two cases have been reported from one house and one case from another. The afflicted ones are quarantined at their homes and every precaution taken to prevent the disease from spreading in the settlement. This morning the health authorities were apprised of three cases of scarlet fever which was contracted in a house on Scott St.

Both of the above mentioned diseases are now on the increase in the city and suburbs and within the last few weeks over fifty cases have been reported.
