German Food Riots Serious.

Paris, May 10.—The Socialist Party issued a statement to-day declaring it had not authorized any of its members to act as delegates at the recent international conference in Switzerland.

It develops that three members of the Chamber of Deputies belonging to the socialist group, M. Rafin-Ducens, Alexander Blanc and M. Prisson, attended the conference, which also was attended by Herr Hoffman, a member of the Prussian Diet and editor of the Vorwarts, and Herr Fleisner, a Saxony Deputy.

The proceedings of the conference were not made public, but it is understood that the French Deputies were informed that riotous conditions in Germany, owing to the food shortage, were much more serious than was generally known.
