Dedication of Bells at St. Thomas's.

St. George for Merry England!

On to-morrow, St. George's Day, April 23rd, the Chime of Bells, designed as part of the memorial to the boys of St. Thomas's Parish who made the Supreme Sacrifice in the Great War, will be blessed and dedicated by the Bishop of Newfoundland. The occasion will be a festive one and the services of the day will begin with the offering of the Holy Eucharist at 7.30, at which the special intentions (in addition to those for which every Eucharist is offered) will be:

- (1) In honor of St. George, Patron Saint of England.
- (2) Thanksgiving to God that by His Divine help England has always conquered her enemies.
- (3) Thanksgiving for the great and good men that England has given to the world in connection with this date: Shakespeare, Born St. George's Day, 1564; Died St. George's Day, 1616; Wordsworth, Died St. George's Day, 1850; the heroes of the Raid on Zeebrugge Harbor, St. George's Day, 1918.
- (4) Solemn remembrance before God of the boys of this Parish to whom this memorial is erected.
- (5) Praise to God for putting in into our hearts to dedicate this memorial to His Glory and their memory.

During evensong 7.30 p.m. the actual service of Dedication will take place, the Bishop, of course, performing the ceremony, and preaching on that occasion. Special hymns will be sung by the choir, and a number of the city priests will attend. All parishioners and friends are invited to be present. The chimes consist of a set of eight tubular bells (made by a well known firm in England, and of a kind much in favor just now as a war memorial,) and after the bells have been dedicated they will chime and play a number of hymn tunes. We understand that five more bells are to be ordered forthwith; this will make it possible to play practically any tune upon them. Later a tablet will be set up in a conspicuous part of the church containing the names of those who have fought and died in the Great War. A.M.D.G.
