

A Deluge of Petitions in Favor of Prohibition.

Election Irregularities Complained Against by Various Members.

OTTAWA, May 6.—The House sat for an hour to-day. Twenty minutes of that time were taken up with the presentation of petitions. Never has there been such a campaign of petitions for prohibition. They have flowed in from Methodist, Baptist and Presbyterian Churches in every district in the Dominion, and daily fill the wire basket in which the assistant clerk takes them after they have been read by the members.

Mr. Steele, who has been ill for a few days, came up to the House this afternoon. He presented a petition from the citizens of the town of St. John's, Nfld., who have petitioned for the prohibition of the sale of liquor in that town. The petition was referred to the Committee on Public Works.
