TRIED TO BE NEAT.

Paisley, Ont., Man Kills Himself at the Jefferson Hotel, Detroit.

Detroit, June 1.—Shortly before 3 o'clock yesterday afternoon the body of James Bain, a man about 45 years of age, was found in a room at the Jefferson Hotel, 602 Jefferson street, with his throat cut from ear to ear. The man had been dead for some hours, and the surroundings indicated a plain case of suicide. He registered at the hotel last Friday, and had been in the city ever since. On Monday night he retired about 10 o'clock, but did not put in an appearance yesterday, and the clerk went to call him after dinner. Repeated rappings on the door brought no answer, and Patrolman Finch was called. He broke open the door, and Bain's body was found stretched on the floor between the door and bed. On a stand at the foot of the bed was a razor, and a vessel in the room was partly filled with blood.

DR. HANAVAN'S DEATH.

Results From the Effects of Gangrene After a Short Illness.

Dr. Matthew J. Hanavan, surgeon-major of Walsley Barracks, passed peacefully away yesterday afternoon after a short illness, the result of gangrene, and his demise has cast a gloom over the whole school. Dr. Hanavan, who was a Canadian, was born June 2, 1842. He graduated with honors from Toronto University in 1868, and began his medical career in the American army, towards the close of the civil war, after which he spent some time in New York hospitals. On coming back to Canada he settled in Stratford, where he carried on a most successful practice for 21 years. A natural love for the study of medicine made him one of the most reliable physicians in Western Ontario. The deceased had for many years occupied the office of surgeon of the Twenty-Eighth Battalion, Stratford, until his appointment to Walsley Barracks in September 1888. He was for some years a representative of the Stratford people on the Board of Education and the City Council. He was also medical supervisor of the C. M. B. A. in Canada, and owing to his warm-hearted and generous nature, he was beloved and respected, as much by the general public and military men throughout Canada as he was in his own family, who will now lose the loss of a loving husband and indulgent father. He was married to Miss Mary A. Kidd, of Dublin, in 1875. The funeral will be a private one.
