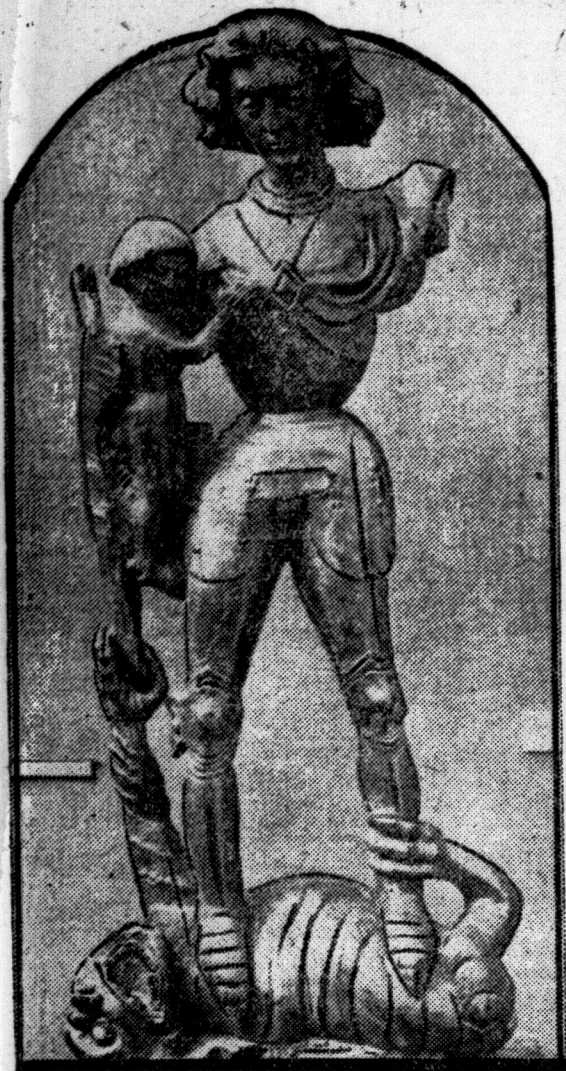
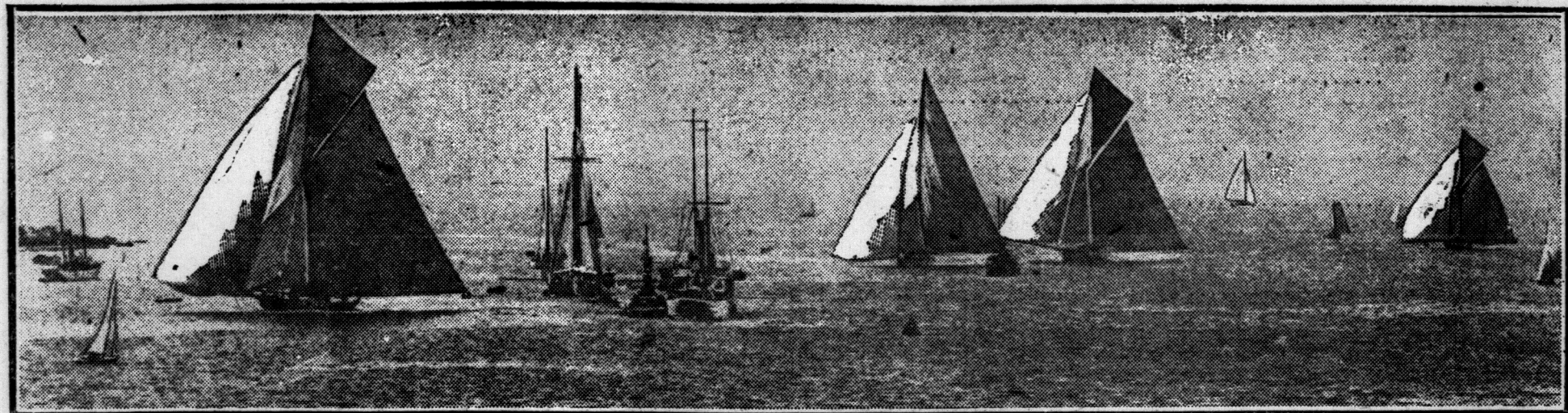

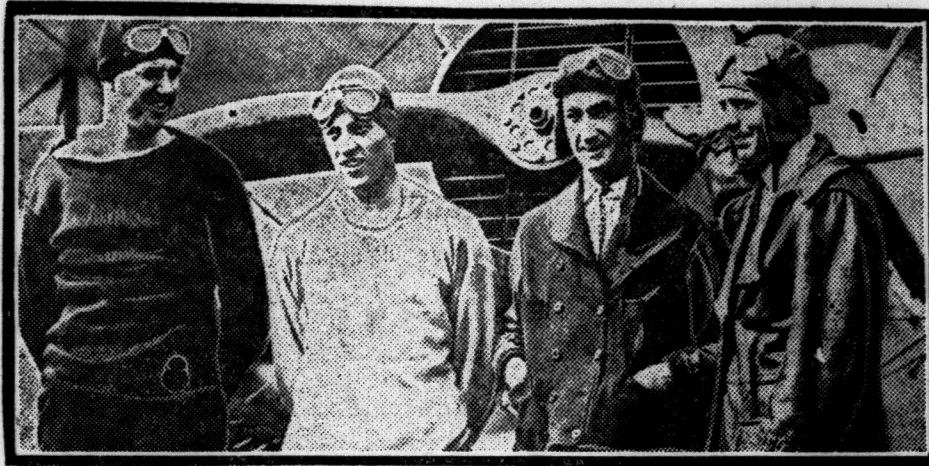
St. Michael, with a saved soul, tramples on the devil. This early fifteenth century oak figure was recently presented to the Victoria and Albert Museum.

Railroads have installed motor plows that serve the double purpose of cutting the weeds and leveling the ballast on the road. This work was formerly done by hand.



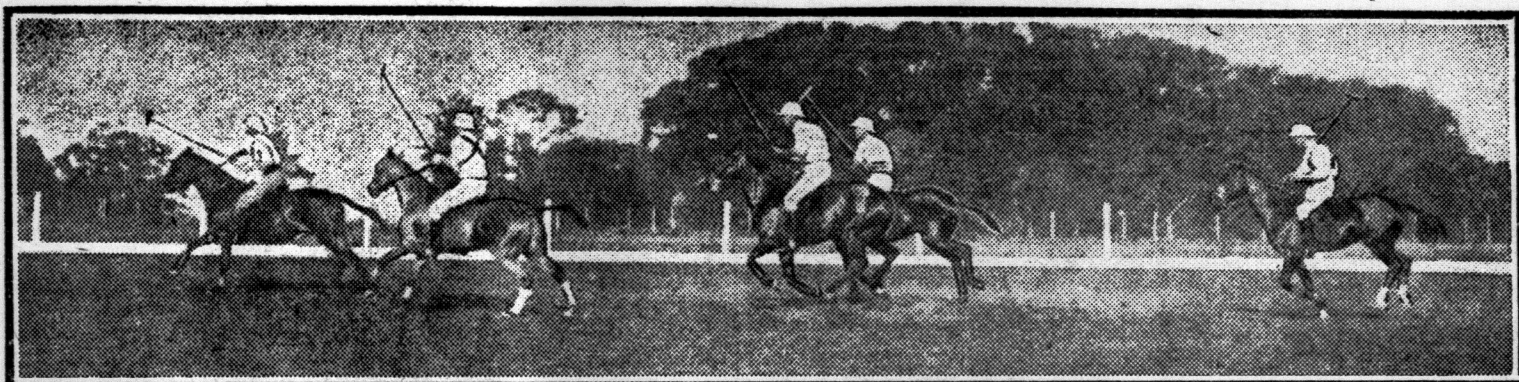
The United States navy will participate in the international seaplane race for the Schneider cup, to be held at Cowes, England. Photograph shows four pilots who will operate machines.



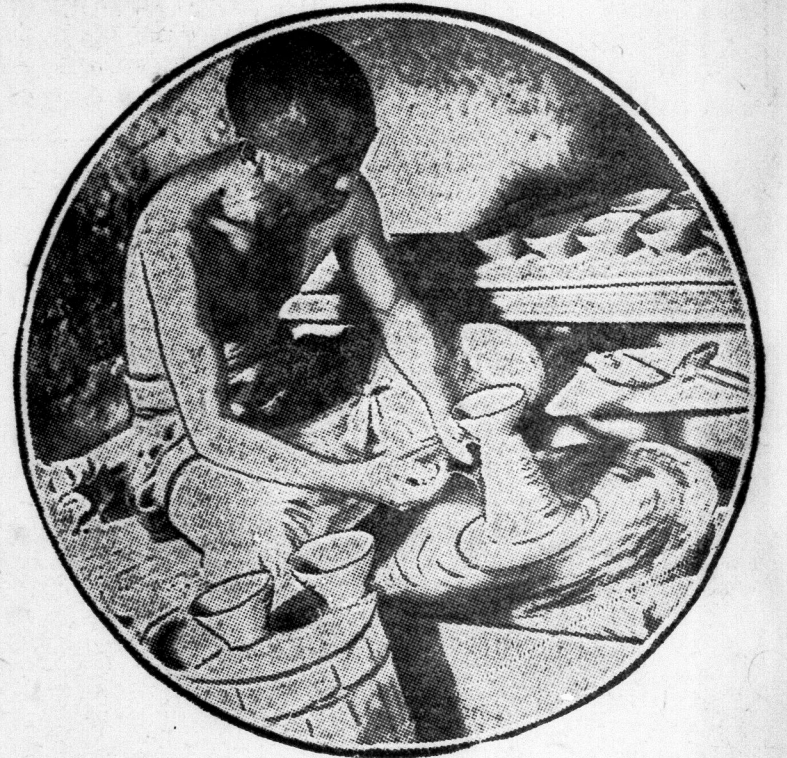
The "blues" is the latest English ball-room dance. The steps are adapted to old South American melodies.

George Horace Lorimer, editor of the Saturday Post and wife are seen on their arrival home after a trip to Europe.



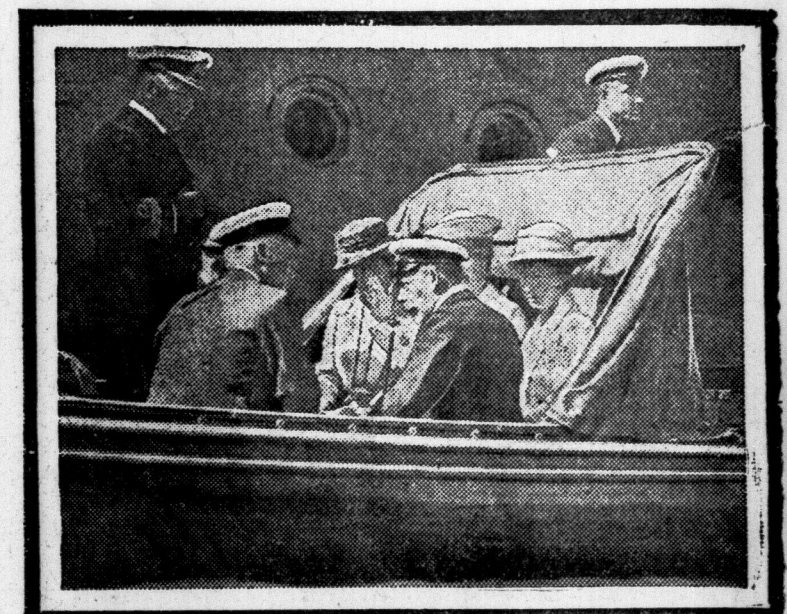
Morris Gest, theatrical producer, has caused a sensation in his circle of friends by returning from Europe in a striking grey "bowler."

The Chinese game of pung chow has become so popular in America and Europe that workmen in the Orient are working day and night in manufacturing sets.



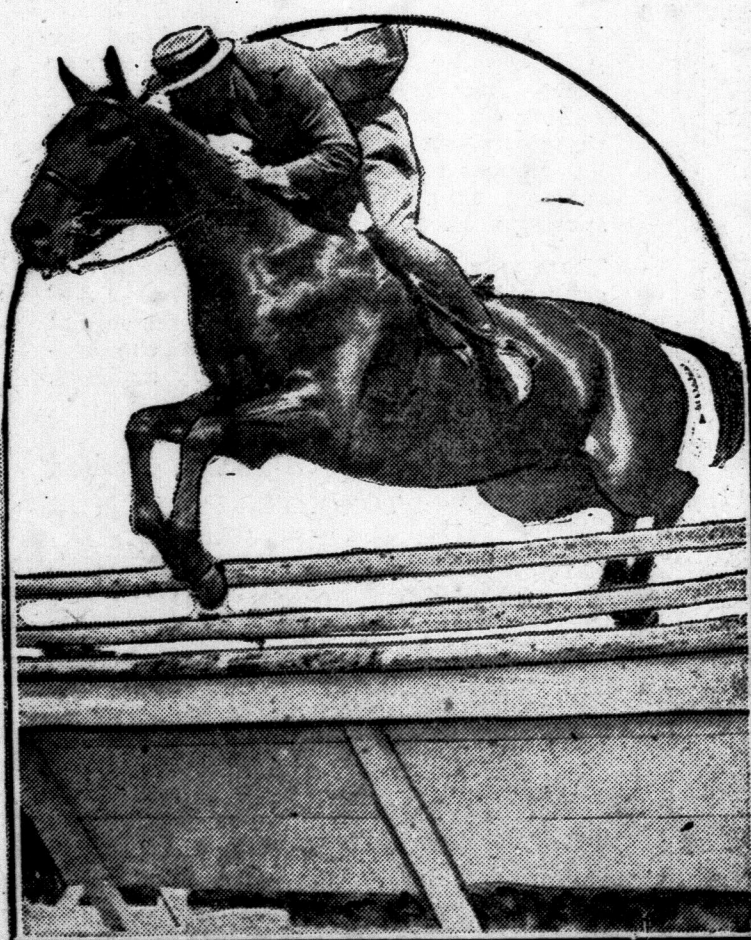
The King and Queen of England are seen in their launch at Cowes at the regatta held recently.



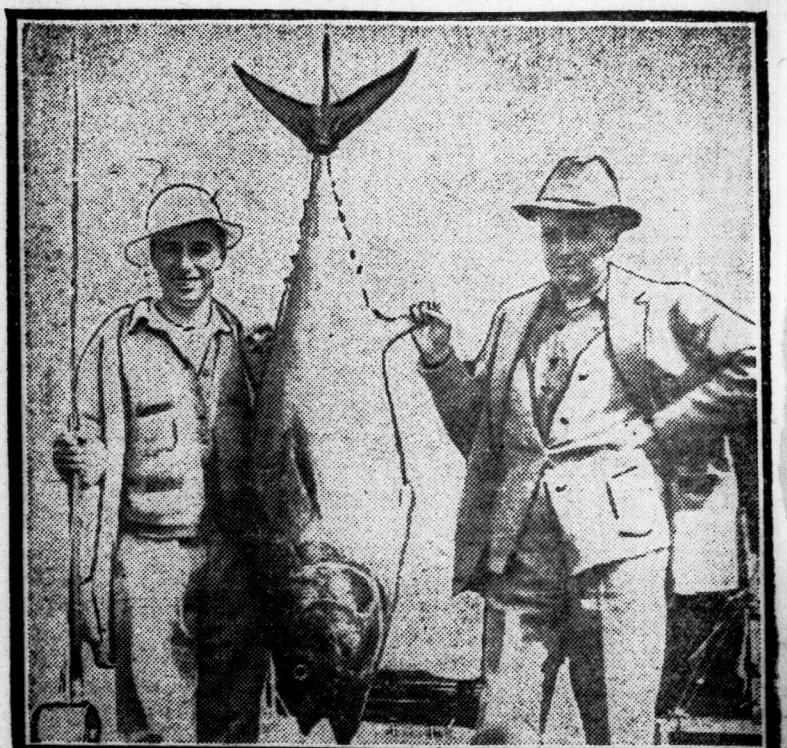
This cigar and confectionery store is said to be the smallest business structure in Chicago. Because of the difficulties and waste in building, it cost in excess of \$6,500.
