Bearing in mind that the foregoing examples of profits are actual results, and that the profits indicated were payable in cash at end of the respective periods, they must not be confounded with estimated results of Companies having no actual profit-sharing record, or of Companies whose actual results do not nearly correspond to their estimates, nor with bonus additions payable only at death or end of Endowment term.
