

#### CHANGE LIGHT HOUSE SYSTEM

Service of Keepers Along the Cape Breton Coast May be Dispensed With

The Marine Department has under consideration the installation of a gas lighting system in all light houses on this coast which will do away with the expenses of keeping lighthouse tenders at salary the year around. This system is already in use in one lighthouse in Sydney harbor and has proven itself entirely satisfactory. Along the coast of Cape Breton

there are at least forty lighthouses and range lights, all of them having keepers who are paid salaries by the government. In Sydney harbor alone there are now four of these lighthouse stations with keepers; in Glace Bay harbor there are two and in Louisburg three.
