

That all other candidates for admission shall give six weeks' notice, pay the prescribed fees, and pass a satisfactory examination upon the following subjects namely, (Latin) Horace, Odes, Book 3; Virgil, Æneidy Book 6; Ciesar, Commentaries, Books 5 and 6; Cieero, Pro Milone. (Mathematics) Arithmetic, Algebra to the end of Quadratic Equations; Euclid, Books 1, 2, and 3. Outlines of Modern Geography, History of England (W-Douglas Hamilton's), English Grammar and Composition-That Articled Clerks shall pass a preliminary examin-ation upon the following subjects : -Cæsar, Commentaries Books5 and 6; Arithmetic : Euclid, Books 1. 2, and 3. Outlines of Modern Geography, History of England (W-Doug, Hamilton's), English Grammar and Composition-Elements of Book-keeping. That the subjects and books for the first Intermediste Examination shall be :-Real Property, Williams; Equity, Smith's Manual; Common Law, Smith's Manual; Act respecting the Court of Chancery (C. S. U. C. c. 12), (C-S U. C. caps. 42 and 44).
