SAULT Ste. MARIE CANAL

Notice to Contractors.

SEALED TENDERS addressed to the under-
 signed and endorsed "Tenders for the Sault
 Ste. Marie Canal" will be received at this office
 until the arrival of the eastern and western
 mails on TUESDAY, the 23rd day of October,
 next, for the formation and construction of a
 Canal on the Canadian side of the river, through
 the Island of St. Mary.

The works will be lot in two sections, one of
 which will embrace the formation of the canal
 through the island; the construction of locks,
 &c. The other, the deepening and widening of
 the channel-way at both ends of the canal; con-
 struction of piers, &c.

A map of the locality, together with plans and
 specifications of the works, can be seen at this
 office on and after TUESDAY, the 9th day of
 October next, where printed forms of tender can
 also be obtained. A like class of information,
 relative to the works, can be seen at the office of
 the Local Officer in the Town of Sault Ste. Marie,
 Ont.

Intending contractors are requested to bear in
 mind that tenders will not be considered unless
 made strictly in accordance with the printed
 forms and be accompanied by a letter stating
 that the person or persons tendering have care-
 fully examined the locality and the nature of
 the material found in the trial pits.

In the case of firms, there must be attached the
 actual signatures of the full name, the nature of
 the occupation and residence of each member of
 the same; and further, a bank deposit receipt for
 the sum of \$30,000 must accompany the tender
 for the canal and locks; and a bank deposit re-
 ceipt for the sum of \$7,500 must accompany the
 tender for the deepening and widening of the
 channel-way at both ends, piers, &c.

The respective deposit receipts—cheques will
 not be accepted—must be endorsed over to the
 Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be
 forfeited if the party tendering declines entering
 into contract for the works, at the rates and on
 the terms stated in the offer submitted.

The deposit receipt thus sent in will be return-
 ed to the respective parties whose tenders are
 not accepted.

ST. LAWRENCE CANALS.

Notice to Contractors.

SEALED TENDERS, addressed to the under-
 signed and endorsed "Tender for the St. Law-
 rence Canals," will be received at this office un-
 til the arrival of the eastern and western mails
 on TUE-DAY, the 25th day of September next,
 for the construction of two locks and the deep-
 ening and enlargement of the upper entrance of
 the Galops Canal. And for the deepening and
 enlargement of the summit level of the Cornwall
 Canal. The construction of a new lock at each
 of the three interior lock stations on the Corn-
 wall Canal between the Town of Cornwall and
 Maple Grove; the deepening and widening the
 channel way of the canal; construction of
 bridges, &c.

A map of each of the localities together with
 plans and specifications of the respective works,
 can be seen on and after TUESDAY, the 11th
 day of September next, at this office for all the
 works, and for the respective works at the fol-
 lowing mentioned places:—

For the works at Galops at the Lock-keeper's
 house, Galops. For deepening the summit level
 of the Cornwall Canal, at Dickenson's Landing;
 one for the new locks, &c., at lock-stations Nos.
 18, 19 and 20, at the town of Cornwall. Printed
 forms of tender can be obtained for the respective
 works at the places mention'd.

 actual signatures of the full name, the nature of
 the occupation and residence of each member of
 the same, and further, a bank deposit receipt for
 the sum of \$8,000 must accompany the tender for
 the Galops Canal Works, and a bank deposit
 receipt for the sum of \$2,000 for each section
 of the works on the summit level of the Cornwall
 Canal; and for each of the lock sections on the
 Cornwall Canal a bank deposit receipt for the
 sum of \$1,000.

The respective deposit receipts—cheques will
 not be accepted—must be endorsed over to the
 Minister of Railways and Canals, and will be
 forfeited if the party tendering declines enter-
 ing into contract for the works at the rates and on
 the terms stated in the offer submitted. The
 deposit receipts thus sent in will be returned to
 the respective parties whose tenders are not
 accepted.
