

Payments are only fair.

FISH.—There has been a better demand this week for white flah, salmon, and trout. Gene-rally the supply is sufficient. Herrings are scarce. Quotations are:—Trout and white fish, 7 to 74c.; herrings, 2 to 24c.; blue pick-erel, 4c.; yellow pickerel, 64c.; perch, 4c.; had-dock, 64c.; and salt water salmon, 15 to 16c. per pound.
