He also presented,—Return to an Order of the House of December 29, 1951 for a Return showing:—1. Has any investigation been made into methods and means of preventing erosion on Lake Erie by reason of the decay of the East pier at Port Bruce, Ontario?

2. If not, will the government give consideration to taking steps designed

to stop the effects of erosion and to remove the cause?
