

MRS. PANKHURST IN JAIL AGAIN

Police Arrest Suffragette Leader as She Sets Out to Address Militant Meeting.

Canadian Press Despatch. LONDON, July 16.—Mrs. Emmeline Pankhurst, the militant suffragette leader, who has been out of jail on bail only a few days, was arrested again tonight and taken to Holloway jail.

Mrs. Pankhurst was released on July 11 on a four days' license and since then has been staying in a nursing home. It has been widely advertised that she would address a meeting of the Women's Social and Political Union in Holland Park Hall this evening, and the police had made elaborate arrangements to intercept her.

A cordon of officers was thrown about the house in which she was stopping. At 8 o'clock a motor ambulance drew up outside and a few minutes later a procession left the house, headed by a bodyguard, with clergymen and doctors. Following them came Mrs. Pankhurst on a stretcher, accompanied by several nurses.

As the suffragette leader was placed in the ambulance two detectives sprang in with her another seized himself beside the driver. Then before the bodyguard realized what had happened Mrs. Pankhurst was speeding toward Holloway jail.

Beyond a little hooting and some cheering there was no demonstration among those about the house, and the crowd quickly dispersed.

PRESIDENT CARBAJAL TO RETIRE

FIND BODY AFTER ELEVEN MONTHS

Discovery at South Porcupine Indicates Fate of W. H. Marston.

DIED FROM GUN WOUND

Supposed Case of Suicide Tells of Grim Tragedy in North.

In September, 1913, W. H. Marston, an assayer, disappeared from the Hollinger Mills in the north country, and until a few days ago, when a body was found in the bush, no inkling of his fate had been found.

A few days ago a body was found in the bush near Porcupine by Provincial Police Constable E. D. Jordan. The body was badly decomposed and means of identification were limited to a tweed suit, long elk boots, soft brown hat and old skin overcoat, all of which Marston wore when last seen.
