

PRONOUNCING VOCABULARY

OF THE UNUSUAL PROPER NAMES IN

The following signs for the variation of the sound of "a" are used in the vocabulary:—

- ā to denote the long sound.
- ǎ to denote the short sound.
- ā̄ to denote the sound as in pāst.
- ǎ̄ to denote the sound as in stār.
- ā̇ to denote the sound as in ball.

For e:—

- ē to denote the long sound.
- ǎ̄ to denote the short sound.
- ē̇ to denote the sound as in hēr.

For i:—

- ī to denote the long sound.
- ǐ to denote the short sound.

For o:—

- ō to denote the long sound.
- ǒ to denote the short sound.

For u:—

- ū to denote the long sound.
- ǔ to denote the short sound.

ā ē ō are similar to sound to ā ē ō, but are not so long.
