The monarchs then reviewed the color company, after which they entered a carriage and drove off together to the new Staendehaus, where the Russian Imperial party will be lodged during their visit to Breslau. The two Empresses followed the Emperor and the Czar, their carriage being driven at a smart pace. The streets through which the two Emperors, the two Empresses and their attendants passed, were lined with people, who cheered the Imperials with great enthusiasm.

About II o'clock the German and Russian Imperial parties re-appeared and in the same order in which they had come drove from the Staendehau to Gandau to witness the parade of the Sixth corps. It was quickly noticed that the German Emperor had changed his uniform having substituted the uniform of a German general for the Russian uniform he wore when he received the Czar. The Nicholas II. Hussars and a squadron of Dragoons guarded the Imperial party on the way to the parade grounds. The Czar opened the parade by leading his regiment of Alexander Guards past the Emperor. 


