THE FERRY CO. AGREEMENT

The ranks of the City Council yesterday afternoon were depleted by the unseating of Messrs. Score and Gowankowick and by the absence of a number of members who were attending the funeral of the late Mr. James Crawford.

Having notified in the Toronto papers that the city is thinking of improving the sewage system, Horace W. Avery wrote Ald. Hanlan, recommending the system of chemical precipitation, followed by pasteurization of the effluent, as carried out by the American Sanitary Engineering Company.

The letter will be dealt with by the Board of Works.

Profests Entertained. R. F. Grant & Co., subway contractors, also wrote protesting against having inexperienced workmen put up railways at the city's expense.

They found fault with the resolution of the Board of Control to remove all material placed thereon by them within six weeks from date they stated that they had been keeping their contract to conform to sanitary regulations.


