HUMANITY SOCIETY MET

And Transacted Business Yesterday Afternoon—Full Report.

The meeting was called to order at 4 p.m., and, in the absence of the president, Mr. Brock, Mrs. Wood took the chair.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and confirmed, the correspondence was taken up, with reference to the letter from the Rev. Mr. Wood.

Considerable discussion ensued and it was decided to appoint a committee to wait upon the Mayor with reference to the matter.

Mrs. Savigny reported a second successful Band of Mercy meeting at the Harmonie Club on Monday evening.

She Mrs. Wood has been asked to visit Port Hope in the interests of Band of Mercy work.

A discussion followed with reference to the future work of the society, in which Mrs. Wood and Mrs. Savigny took a prominent part.

It seemed to be the general feeling of the meeting that the efforts of the society should be largely of an educational character.

It was suggested that a circular setting forth the great importance of humane education in the interests of posterity should be addressed to the various municipalities and school teachers in Ontario, and that the local doctors should be urged to give attention to the problem of the day.

It is not considered in the humane work to be the best method of securing the object aimed at by prosecuting offenders in the courts of justice, as much as it is to the humane work.

There were ten prosecutions reported since the last meeting, out of which three were convictions secured.

A cow that had been badly burned at a late fire in the city and was kept for two weeks by the owner in the hopes that it would recover.

Finally, when it had become hopeless, it was taken to a slaughter house and was dragged along for a considerable distance in a bleeding condition.

The humane officers were notified of the case and proceeded to the slaughter house before the Police Magistrate, who made an exemplary fine of \$1 and costs.

The next monthly meeting will be held on the second Friday in December.
