HIS SEAT IS STILL IN DOUBT

Member of School Board and Also of County Council Up for Judgment.

ALD. KINGDON IS CALLED DOWN

D. D. Watts Several Times Insults That Water Committee Is No Gentleman.

Hamilton, Feb. 18.—Ex-Warden Jacob B. Kinley will know within the next few days whether he will be able to retain his seat in the County Council or not. Judge Salder heard the lawyers argue his case this afternoon. No evidence was taken, as all the facts were admitted. The ex-warden was a member of a rural school board when he was elected a member of the County Council for West Flamboro by acclamation on Dec. 22 last. Lieut. Col. Gwyn, Dundas, looked after the case for those who are trying to unseat the councillor. W. E. S. Judge Salder reserved judgment, but promised to make known his decision in a day or so, if possible.
