

TORONTO FLOODED WITH BAD AMERICAN QUARTERS

For Three Weeks Street Railway and Departmental Stores Have Noticed Them.

Toronto is again the scene of operations as the part of counterfeiters, from where is as yet unknown. This time the city is being flooded with American quarter dollars. For the last three weeks it is estimated that hundreds of dollars' worth of these spurious coins has been disposed of in the city. About every available source for the distribution of the bogus money has been taken advantage of and as yet no one has been named as the perpetrator.

The street cars, from information gained, have been chosen as the principal means of unloading the "queer." Every day for the past three weeks conductors have been told to be on the lookout for these coins. The big departmental stores have also been singled out. There has not been a day pass. It is stated that half a dozen or more bad Yankee quarters have been found in the pockets of street railway men.

From the fact of this particular coin it would seem almost certain that Toronto is the dumping ground of a clever gang of crooks. Extensive stores and saloons have had to refuse to accept these coins within this time. The most peculiar part of the affair is that a brand new counterfeit issue of Canadian half dollars is also in large circulation. From the appearance of the counterfeit of both coins it would appear as if they came from the same source. Hundreds of counterfeit half dollars have also been handed in to the departmental stores but had to suffer the indignity of having the money they presented in payment of a purchase, returned to them with the word "counterfeit" stamped on it. It is reported that the counterfeiters are being chased from the street railway office to be exchanged for good ones, declaring they received them from the car conductors. The quarters have also been handed in to the company's cashier by the conductors themselves. The remarkable circulation these coins have gained is an evidence of the rapid circulation.

The most careful examination of the coin by the average citizen would fail to reveal the slightest dissimilarity between it and the genuine. The bogus quarter has a fine brilliancy almost the same ring and to an unpracticed hand about the same weight. The only defect, and one that is to be feared from the ordinary individual, is its milling. They are stamped on the edge in plain relief. The counterfeit is quite irregular. The persistency with which this money has been presented made it the belief that a well-organized plan has been arranged, with Toronto as central point of circulation. Examination of the counterfeit shows them to contain nothing but the same metal as the real ones and their principal composition. It is now on foot to discover the starting point of the wonderful circulation. The situation the police are trying to solve is the old chestnut—where did the money come from? Nothing as yet points to the counterfeiters being made here, and it is generally thought that a gang from the United States have managed to get their product across the line.
