"If we continue," says Mr. Lavergne in Le Nationaliste "in the same course we have followed during the past thirty years we will soon be a race of outcasts. If, however, we resolutely turn to the paths of reform, if we raise our heads and no longer sacrifice our national pride to the interests of office, there is still room for hope. Our destiny would be a proud one, either as a part of the Canadian confederation or of the American empire. For my part I consider it most probable that our English-speaking compatriots will one day quarrel and break from their mother country and abandon Great Britain. These people, who should be united with us, and who are the mainstay of the British empire, are turning their backs on us when we only desire their welfare. They have but one end in view, the fusion of the races and the taking away of our language and our religion. I believe that the French method, which has worked for so many years, contained their rancor and accepted the most painful situation in order not to harm one of their own who occupies the first position in the land, will suddenly awaken to the stern reality of the situation and that they can no longer count upon their English fellow-citizens who will do them so with joy and happiness, and who will be their main British subjects for a while longer."

He enlisted in the 15th Pennsylvania Cavalry and subsequently served with the first West Virginia. He served with distinction through the war, and at Five Forks he rode to the rank of captain.

James Bay Railway Construction is Going on Slowly, But Surely, Up Don Valley.
The surveyors for the James Bay Railway Company, definitely settled the route by which the line will run under the C.P.R. bridge near the Don Mills bridge yards on Friday. A number of surveys have been made during the past week, but the first one made on Friday is considered the most feasible and likely to meet the objections of the C.P.R. The C.P.R. objected to it being run in an oblique direction because the trains would pass near to the bridge. The surveyors proposed to run the line straight through the arch. By the new survey that is what will be done; but a greater deviation will be made to get the line away from the bridge. The C.P.R. property will be required than by the first survey.
