PEACE PACT FOR CENTRAL AMERICA

Expected to Do Away With War for Many Years to Come.

Washington, April 25 .- Details of the treaty of peace between Nicaragua and Salvador, which was signed at Amapala on Tuesday last, were received at the state department today. The treaty is similar to that entered into a year ago and known as the "Marblehead pact," and it includes a provision for a general Central American peace congress to be held in Nicaragua in the near future and a special commercial treaty between Nicaragua

and Salvador. The new conference will be the third of a series of such gatherings of tha republics of Central America, each and all to conserve the peace of that section of the world. The first conference was held in 1905 and resulted in the adoption of a scheme for the settlement of issues between the republics. which, if it had been adhered to, would have put an end for all time to the frequent wars.
