While he has a duty to perform to employees as far as conditions reasonably permit, there is likely to be a largely reduced number of operatives, with a corresponding reduction in salaries, having an unfavorable influence on trade in our cities. Many trades now doing apparently a prosperous business will find their stocks carried, depreciating from month to month, causing, I fear, many failures, especially among traders who have kept their stocks up to normal, assuming the present inflated prices would continue.

Entertained. Instead of creeping into the city unmet and without official welcome on Sunday evening, the nine returned soldiers who arrived at \$:25 o'clock, were greeted by Lieut. H. C. McKendrick, casualty officer of District Depot. Six of them were taken straight to the Princess avenue school, where a good hot supper was served to them Purthermore, some of the men being short of cash, Lieut. McKendrick got the paymaster to come down, and these officers advanced money to the needy out of their own pockets. The other men wanted and were given immediate furlough to go to their homes.

When The Advertiser used a story on Wednesday stating that there was no When The Advertiser used a story on Wednesday stating that there was no one at the station to meet these men, and that one of the party took them up to the Princess avenue school only to find the place closed for the night, and no preparations made for their arrival, it did so on the word of one who ought to have been beyond suspicion. It was known that no word of the party having left New York reached the Soldiers' Aid Commission until Wednesday, and this seemed to bear out the man's statements. The facts, however, were contrary to his assertions, since word was received on Sunday morning by the District Depot that the men had left New York. No time was mentioned, either of departure or arrival, and because of this lack the depot did not notify the Soldiers' Aid Commission, hoping to have something definite to tell the commission at any moment.

Lieut. McKendrick met every train from New York on the chance that the men might arrive, and at last they stepped to the platform.

It is maintained as a kind of home for all returned soldiers, and any veteran passing through the city at any time is welcome to enjoy its hospitality and stay the night, whether he is on leave or on duty. The London authorities pride themselves on doing everything in their power for returned men, having an especially friendly feeling because they are all wound-stripe men themselves.




