COUNTERFEIT WHISKY

LABELS AND REVENUE STAMPS DISCOVERED

U. S. Secret Service Officers Make Important Seizure in Detroit.

WINDSOR, Oct. 27.—The centre of anti-liquor operations on the border shifted today to Detroit, where, after investigations which have been under way since last August, five men were arrested by United States secret service officers, charged with making and possessing counterfeit Canadian inland revenue stamps, neck bands and labels of Hiram Walker's Imperial whisky.

Liquor and mash also were seized, and charges under the prohibition act will be made.

Men Arrested. The men arrested were Isador Luvish, Samuel Leider, George Wall, Vicent Bui and Samuel Weinberg. The arrests were made by Joseph A. Palma, chief of the United States secret service in Michigan; Agents Hyman, Wandling and Boos and Detectives Brice and Lockwood.

At 232 Montcalm street east, 1,000 stamps, labels and neck bands were found. At Leider's home 18 cases of whisky bottled and bottled and 100 empty Hiram Walker bottles were found. At Luvish's a gallon of alcohol, 25 gallons of home-made whisky and six 53-gallon barrels of fermenting cornmeal and yeast mash. All the whisky seized will be analysed.

ST. THOMAS, Oct. 27.—Power short-circuiting, the proposal of W. K.
