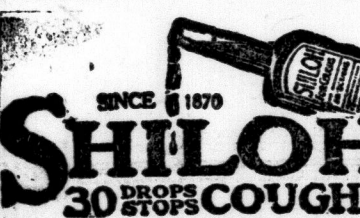

SOCCER, LIKE BASEBALL, HAS SHADY PLAYERS AND DEALS

England Amazed at Revelations Recently Made Over National Pastime.

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—Other folks have their troubles, too. Just as we were amazed and shocked by the revelations that certain baseball players had accepted bribes to "throw" the 1913 World Series, the sporting circles and public in England have been amazed by the discovery that famous football players there were indulging in similar practices.

Football is a close rival of cricket in British popular favor. It is, in fact, one of the British national games. British brothers are now conducting some "mopping up" operations that are expected to overcome the suspicious practices that have been indulged in by famous players.

The universal demand that was heard on every hand for a "clean up" of the British game, took a prominent part, according to a letter which I have just received from a prominent British sportsman. He informs me that Bishop Weiden, the Dean of Durham, led in the campaign for a football regeneration, and quotes the Dean as saying:

"Football is the most democratic of games; yet it better not be played at all if it cannot be played in the spirit of true sport."

The Dean is the most democratic of those who might be leaders in influencing a better sporting spirit. He is inclined to shrug their shoulders and say, "Well, what could you expect?"

As the result of the demand of the Dean and the public support given him, all the managers of the leading football teams are doing everything possible to eliminate every dishonest player. Not one has attempted to dispute the facts presented as to dishonorable practices.

Wonder what would happen if any of the leading churches in America should call for reformation in any branch of sport. Would they be hoisted at from one end of the country to the other? Think it over.

VESSEL, AFLAME, IN SPECTACULAR RACE WITH TIME

Explosion on Freighter Ends in Fire—Vessel Is Beached.

NEW YORK, Nov. 10.—After a spectacular race against time down the Hudson River, surrounded by puffing tugs and fireboats, and a general cargo, have been accounted for, the burning Morgan Line freighter, El Mundo, tonight lay beached on the shore of the Hudson River, out of the way of harbor traffic.

Flames which started from an explosion in her forward cargo hold, shortly after 3 o'clock continued to burn briskly, sweeping the freighter from bow to stern, despite the efforts of a swarm of fire-fighters to hold them in control.

The ship, a craft of 10,000 tons, is almost a complete wreck, with her sides torn by blasts and her forward superstructure carried away by the fire.

All members of the crew of the ill-fated El Mundo, which arrived here from Galveston, port Monday, were safely rescued. Eight of the deckhands were reported seriously burned, one probably fatally.

More than a score of longshoremen and members of the crew were unloading the vessel at the Southern Pacific Pier when the fuel tank, containing several thousand gallons of oil, burst, and the flames, hurling in all directions and carrying away a section of the deck. Plates on the port side also were torn, and the ship immediately began to list.

Sprayed by burning oil, many workers on the pier had narrow escapes from being burned to death. Several also had the clothes blown from their bodies by the force of the blast, which shook the waterfront for blocks.

GALT.—The Kiwanis Club has undertaken to raise charge of the local campaign to take \$7,500, the city's share of the \$25,000 fund required by the Waterloo County Health Association to reopen the Freeport Sanatorium as a hospital for the treatment of tuberculosis.

CHATHAM.—The local Mexican colony will be disbanded and sent back to the "country" of revolutionary Mexico, according to officials of the Dominion Sugar Company. About 500 Mexicans were employed by the company to assist in taking care of the best crop this year, and now that their work is completed they will be sent back to Mexico.

KITCHENER.—Joe Marks, provincial secretary of the Independent Labor party, addressed a meeting of the local organizations last night. At the close of the address the meeting voted to enter candidates in the municipal elections. The question of a candidate for mayor was left over.

BRANTFORD.—Oxford street, the link between Colborne street and the Burford road, the highway to Woodstock, as a name, went out of existence yesterday. It will in future be known as Colborne street west, and the assessors today started renumbering all the houses in accordance with an order from the city council.

WOODSTOCK.—At an organization meeting of the Division Court Bailiffs' Association of Ontario held in Toronto, J. W. Payne of Woodstock was elected secretary-treasurer. The other officers included: Chairman, Charles Sykes, Niagara Falls; executive committee, J. M. Dyckman, Brantford; Allan Meyer, Kitchener; D. W. Fries, Stratford; J. A. Atkinson, Hamilton, and James Dryden, Hamilton.

WEST LORNE.—The annual Elgin Winter Fair will be held here for three days, commencing November 23.
