Hon. William Armson Willoughby, M.D., minister without portfolio in the Whitney cabinet, died at his home in Colborne yesterday morning at 5

Dr. Willoughby's health had been more or less seriously affected since last summer, when he paid a visit to Germany, in the interests of psychia-tric practice in the provincial hospitals. Bright's disease is given as the cause

of death.

He was born in the Township of West Gwillimbury, Simcoe County, Feb. 2, 1844, and educated at Bradford Grammar School and Victoria College, whence he graduated in 1867. After considerable municipal service he was returned to the legislature in 1886, for East Northumberland, but was unseated on petition and defeated at the subsequent by-election in 1888.
