## BRITISH PRESS GERMAN BACK NEAR FREZENBURG IN BELGIUM

### Important Aerial Operations Are Conducted Against German Points

**SENATE THROWN INTO TURMOIL BY CHOQUETTE**  
 Sir James Loughheed Would Not Tolerate Such Seditious Sentiment.  
**DENOUNCED AS TRAITOR**  
 Speaker Says He Named Choquette, But Later Denies This.

 Ottawa, Sept. 6.—The usually placid senate was thrown into a state of turmoil today that has seldom been equalled in the annals of parliament. The crowd that had assembled to hear Solicitor-General Meighen explain the federal franchise bill in the senate chamber and hurried over to the central figure of the scene was Senator Choquette, who seemed unable to understand the excitement his remarks had created. He had indeed set a lighted match to a powder keg by denouncing the Conscription Act, and practically advocating that Canada send no more men to the front.

**NEW FRANCHISE BILL**  
 Conscientious Objectors and Aliens Naturalized Since 1902 Disfranchised; Wives, Widows, Mothers and Sisters of Soldiers Given Ballot.

 Ottawa, Sept. 6.—Those who will be allowed to vote at the next federal election in Canada are: All civilian citizen males over 21, except conscientious objectors to military service; those of alien enemy origin who have become naturalized citizens within fifteen years, and those of alien enemy mother tongue, altho born in other countries and naturalized less than fifteen years ago.

**BRITISH CARRY LINE FORWARD BEYOND PRES**  
 Local Attacks Press Germans Back North of Frezenberg.  
**MUCH AERIAL RAIDING**  
 Haig's Aviators Bomb Works at Ghent, Douai, Maubeuge and Cambrai.

London, Sept. 6.—The official report from British headquarters in France tonight reads:  
 "On Wednesday there was again great activity in the air. The enemy on several occasions interrupted the work of our artillery machines and attacked our airplanes employed on long-distance bombing raids. A few bombs were dropped behind our lines by hostile machines during the night; little damage was done.

**BRITISH NATIONS SOON TO TRIUMPH**  
 Germany Has Not Felt Final Strain of War, Premier Says.  
**HUMANITY'S BIG DEBT**  
 More Freedom in Peace Would Have United Russia in War.

Birkenhead, England, Sept. 6.—Germany has not yet felt the final strain of the war, said Premier Lloyd George, speaking at the Royal National Eisteddfod today here. When she did, he continued, she would feel the binding value of real freedom. If Russia had enjoyed more freedom in peace, he declared, the premier, she would have been more united in war, for unity of action was not a suppression of freedom, but its highest expression.

**HOOPER NOT TO FIX U. S. MEAT PRICES**  
 American Food Controller Will Not Interfere With Dairy Products.  
**FINDS NO PANACEA**  
 U. S. Government Will Strive to Increase General Production.

Washington, Sept. 6.—Price fixing for meat and dairy products has no place in the government's food control plans, Herbert Hoover, the food administrator, today told the National Livestock Conference. Not only would it be inadvisable to institute price fixing in these industries, he declared, but the food administration has been given no such power.

**BIG FIGHT RAGES FOR MONTE SAN GABRIELE**  
 Summit of Important Peak Frequently Changes Hands—Italians Continue Heavy Offensive on Plateau Northeast of Gorizia.  
 London, Sept. 6.—Italian troops, fighting stubbornly for Monte San Gabriele on the Isonzo front, have several times captured the summit only to be thrown back again, according to telegrams from Austrian headquarters, says the Central News' Amsterdam correspondent. The Italians are continuing their attack on the mountain.

**NIGHT ATTACK BY CANADIANS**  
 British Columbians Capture Important Row of Houses by Bombing.  
**TAKE PART OF TRENCH**  
 Another Party of Dominion Troops Gains on Green Crassier.

Canadian Headquarters in France, via London, Sept. 5.—Another of the small surprise attacks which almost nightly reduce the area within Lens still remaining in the enemy's hands took place at 3.30 this (Thursday) morning, and resulted in the capture of a row of houses occupied by four companies of the First Regiment, First Prussian Guard Reserve Division. Men from British Columbia, accustomed in civil life to finding their way about the work, and did it well, sustaining few casualties themselves while inflicting a considerable number on the enemy.

**How About Prices for Ontario Grain?**

 Until we know what prices are fixed for wheat all over Canada by the Dominion Board of Grain Supervisors now in session at Winnipeg, it will be good policy for the Ontario to get all the information that is obtainable as to the prices offered by the buyers in this province for our three great staple grains: wheat (fall and spring), barley, oats, all now beginning to come on the market.

**HUNGARY WILL EXPEL VISITORS FROM ALLIES**  
 Government Closes Gates to Swarms of Food-Seekers.  
 Copenhagen, Sept. 6.—Hungary, which has acquired a reputation in the central empire as a land flowing with milk and honey, where eggs, butter and white bread are still to be obtained, has been compelled to close her gates to swarms of her allies.

**BIG WAR CREDITS BILL PASSES LOWER HOUSE**  
 United States Senate Will Take Up Measure Soon.  
 Washington, Sept. 6.—The great war credits bill authorizing \$1,538,945,460 in bonds and certificates, passed the house tonight unanimously. Action by the senate as soon as the pending war tax bill is disposed of is planned by administration leaders.

 London, Sept. 6.—(Via Reuter's Ottawa Agency.)—In conversation with a representative of Reuter's a high British naval authority, speaking of the submarine menace, said it must be remembered that Germany was staking everything on U-boat warfare, therefore every loss of its intimated ships was not surprising. There are indications, he said, of larger submarines, approximately of the cruiser type, being turned out. However, Germany has no prospect of success within the time she is likely to have at her disposal, for with Germany there must be a time limit.
